Wales were here at supper we went  
ground Hog shooting awhile this  
evening, got none. W. fine & clear  
I & Mary went to Markham A.M.  
16 B got Mare May shed H brought  
load sand from W. Milnes A.M.  
H & B brought 2 loads P.M.  
I & A fished fences. W. very  
Cold & strong N. wind

Sunday Whit Sunday 17 Isaac Rivers  
were here at dinner B's girls were  
at A.B.'s I & Mary & little ones went  
to B's C. to supper they were in yard  
but came home early W. clear & cool  
a little cloudy towards evening

Whit Monday 18 I went to Cedar Grove  
A.M. when I got home B's in-law Simon  
Hoover's thin son Albert & his wife  
Annie Raymond. Their daughter Mary  
& her man Frank Williamson were here  
& wanted to go to fish so I & J & B  
went with them to Mouth of Rouge  
got very few. W. cool north wind clear

19 I & J <sup>May 1891</sup> went to Markham for 6  
Barrels of lime A.M. I & A took 700  
ft Maple flooring to D. Rennie P.M.  
H & B began digging kitchen  
foundation at other house I & Mary  
Susanna & Mary & B's in-law Peter  
Hoover's went fishing to Mouth of  
Rouge Cary Pt. about 60 fine  
ones I plowed in turning ground  
W. clear & cool

20 B helped I & H finish digging  
foundation A.M. he finished  
spreading dung P.M. I & A spread  
A.M. I plowed A helped P.M.  
W. a very little rain A.M. very fine  
& clear today, real warm

I & H drove stones into foundation  
21 Finished driving stones into founda-  
tion & finished plowing our turning  
ground. W. very warm

22 B helped H finish plowing turning  
ground at other place & A helped kill  
Flavis 2 pigs he sold them to Lewis  
for \$15.00 I bought them of H Rennie
