Feeding in Post-Operative Acidosis.

Acting on the assumption that post-anesthetic vomiting called for an interdiction of food, we heightened the degree of this acid intoxication by further starvation. Or if we did give food, it was of such a nature that it was poorly calculated to combat the development of acid intoxication. We gave beef tea or malted milk when we should have used carbohydrates, such as baked potatoes, cornstarch pudding or mush. I have often seen post-operative vomiting which had resisted all palliative measures cease immediately after the giving of these substantial starches.—S. T. Pope; J. A. M. A.
