

Saturday October 29<sup>th</sup>

When I got home Dad and I put off the load of clover seed that was on the team floor and went out and got a small load of corn stalks. We gathered up all the horse manure and a couple of shovels that were down. We put them off before dinner. This afternoon Dad went out and hauled up what was left of the clover seed. I helped him as soon as I got the chore done. We went out about four o'clock to load it. We cleared the field but it took a lot of running around and we didn't get in till nearly six. Mary & Euch went down town this afternoon and Mary intended going to Miss M.'s rum sale but there was such a crowd she didn't go. I went down to a Tris meeting to night and we initiated Andrew Lowe. I then went up to Harry Eyer's and got my hair cut. They say the mill (Penman's) is going to close for an indefinite time for lack of orders, so the shadow of events that darken the world intrude even here. Business all over is in a chaotic state and it looks as though the world was in for hard times this winter.

Sunday October 30<sup>th</sup>

Mary and I went to Sunday school and church and Dad and Euch drove down to church. Aunty and Aunty Alice came over here for dinner but I drove them home before tea. Uncle Ward and Harry Moon were in for awhile this afternoon. We did the chores up early and Mary and I went down to church to night with the Barwells when they came after Euch. John Deem read the first lesson to night and Bill Barwell the second and they did very well. Mary and I did the collection to night, but didn't enter it. It has been lovely weather this last week, very mild & no frost to hurt crops.

Monday October 31<sup>st</sup>

It rained a little during the night so Dad had to take Sid to school. I did chores while he was gone and when he came back we put off the load of clover seed and took the rack off the wagon and put the box on. Then before dinner we cleared out the cellar ready to put the mangle in. This afternoon we hauled manure and got in two loads, two rows to a load, but didn't put the last load off. Mary went down town this afternoon.
