- 1 Ad took our milk to the road this morning there is no one drawing this way this year he saved 4 bushel of Peas and 4 bushel of oats in the North field where he sown fallow last year
 - 2 Ad took Mr Ferguson up to James Corneil's with Willows Ad finished the North field this forenoon then drew some stones front field East line & plowed three medges of the garden fine day
 - 3 Ad took the old saw out the road to Tuesday & plowed them & planted a glass Plum tree that I got from the Fruit growers association hand ^{front} last
 - 4 Ad sowed 3 bushel of peas that he got at Penton last winter in the front field East line Billie came home with a Raller for Ad I cut some potatoes cold day Ad dragged the garden & furrowed out 4 rows for carrots
 - 5 Ad finished at the road to day I planted some potatoes in the garden & raked down the 4 rows for carrots I met Rev Mr Nicholson at the Station he came home with me Wm Corneil is to take him to Fair
 - 6 Mr Slitter preached this morning Mr Nicholson at night
 - 7 Mr Nicholson went to Kingston on the Express I planted a few Black ^{and} Black peas green peas & white peas in the front field East line
 - 8 cold time I planted 1 row red Surry Corneil 1 row Scallion Intermediate Corneil 2 rows Park Flat Egyptian Beet in the garden & finish planting the garden
 - 9 we went to the funeral of old Mr Bradley the Rev Stewart preached in the New Church here Mr Stewart was buried at Sanders burning place there was 50 there
 - 10 Throat cut the catts this afternoon Ad is helping
 - 11 Ad helped Bruce I worked a little at the Milk Sheed dry cold time
 - 12 Ad went to Jerry White's got his horse & I met friend Mr Nicholson at the Station
 - 13 Rev Mr Nicholson preached this morning Mr ^{member} at night
 - 14 Ad drew 3 loads of ashes to the garden & 1 horse fine day we got a Telegram at 10 o'clock to night the Betsey was very sick & to go down at once
 - 15 Ad took me down before sun rose this morning Betsey died this morning at 3 o'clock before we got there

Ad finished all heavy expect the Millet
