March 5th
Friday

Wind changed in the night. Windm
covered with frost again and quite a
fall of snow. Did some work for Charles.
Then cut out pictures, at the same
time cleaning out shelf under couch.

Went down town in the afternoon and
shovelled the walk when I came home. (Was
at it half an hour) after reading the
Globe and the Enterprise continued
'cut-out' work. It got quite stormy.
Mr Schmidt said it was the
stormiest day this winter out in
the country but I fancy he has forgotten
some of the storms. Bad day, however,
Went to Dunsmuir, Carmichael's night, fixed
Bert Leuker's head dress. Slept outside

March 6th - Worked all morning for Charles.
(Saturday). Mr Caldwell still confined to the house.
Continued 'cut-out' work. Fine,
bright day but still very frosty.
Went down town in the afternoon.
after tea Dr. Richter came up to see
Charles, re that Mr Eric V. Halladay.
Continued cut-out work. Cold so
slept inside. Have a bad cold.

March 7th - Still cold but bright. Church again
(Sunday) 5-day. Went to Church and to S. S.
Did not go to Church at night as I
had neuralgia in my head. Quite stormy

when we came home from school.
Meeting after - S. S. to discuss Graded Helps.
not considered very feasible. Nurses, Ella
McLean, Irene Halliday, C. Pollack, Mr. Jones
and myself are to meet - at - our house
to-morrow night - and try and re-arrange
classes upstairs. Wrote to Coker re box
for Dorothy's birthday. Played Re-frain
for an hour. Charlie and Alice came
up after church. Very windy so shall
sleep inside.

March 8th - Charles left for Walkeston - on the
(Monday) early train. Blocked and did
not leave until about 8.20. Mrs.
Ryan made a mistake and called
him at 5.15 a.m. He had mixed
up his watch in setting it - to, and
came in at 1.15 to know the time
is altogether he had a disturbed
night. Did some work that Charles
left for me. Wrote to Miss McNaughton
for Mrs. M. G. G. Then went down
with my work. Very stormy. Had a
letter from Frank asking for in-
formation in regard to relatives in

Victoria & Vancouver. Went into the
Office and answered it at once as
Frank wanted the letter before he
leave California (about 15th) came
home & shovelled out the walk. Had
a P. S. meeting to change classes &c.
Irene Halladay, Ella McKean, Cassie
Pollock, Mr. & Mrs. Ince here. Had
sandwiches & coffee for them. Duncan
was here for an hour before they came
looking at "Life". Train cancelled.
Had telephone message from
Hannover where the men, Charles, Dr.
Biehn & B. D. Halladay (His case in
the West) have to stay all night.
Very stormy day. Slept inside.

March 9th
^{Tuesday}
~~Monday~~ Much milder to day. Charles
drove up from Hannover and
got here a few minutes before
11. Came home to dinner but
had to hurry back to District
Court as train got in about
one o'clock instead of at 4.30
as reported at Hannover would be
the case. Yesterday morning's train

is reported of the track up north -
Eva Mc Donald, ready to go to Toronto,
and Ida Halladay, going to Achen to
visit Ethelyn, both are stranded
here until there is a train. Did
some shorthand, some French & some
memory work. Practised both times alto-
gether. Went up to see Mother: Mild but
storming when I came home, Judge
Greig came up for tea and while he
was here I did part of an initial on
my dresser cover. Slept outside.

March 10th - Did some work for Charlie. Went
Wednesday down to Mrs. Lewis for my music lesson.
Came home and shovelled snow for
an hour. Eva Mac. Mc Donald and
Pearl Buckley called - Pearl was
returning a book she borrowed.
Practised in an hour altogether &
did some short-hand & French.
Have moved inside 15 steps. Work today.

March 11th - Did some work for Charles. Got my
Thursday. P. S. orders ready and went down
to the bank with them. Mr. Ince came

Up at 11 a.m. and we arranged to
start a new Cradle Roll. Went
out and shovelled snow for
an hour. Wrote to Dorothy and
Clare. Practised $3/4$ of an hour.
Duncan came up in the evening
and we played seven-ups. Was
11 p.m. when he went home. He
owed me 30 sticks of timber - Charles
was reduced to 5 and I, having
78, had increased my capital
more than threefold. Rained in night.
1st rain since November.

March 12th

Friday. Rather a jubilation in the bath-
room this morning as it rained
in night and tank half full. Had
a real bath and a shampoo.
Was busy until 10 o'clock with office
work. Wrote to Nell and a
birthday letter to Dorothy who will
be 21 years old on Sunday. I sent
her \$10 and her dad sent her \$15.
Raining at least. Showery day. Roads
are impassable. At Mr. Peter Kincaid's
funeral, which is today. Theleigh

(Hearse could not get out - I is to be
drawn by me. Shovelled snow for
an hour. Had to write a note for
Free Press for Charles & type it after tea.
Freezing at night.

March 13th

Saturday Very cold day. Did the entries then,
as Mr. Caldwell is away (to Hamilton to
visit a friend & have his eyes tested).
Charles telephoned me and I went to the
office & got some work and came home to
do it on my own typewriter. Did my
darning and mending (at noon &
after tea) Went to the office for the after-
noon but did not get a chance to
get much work as there were so many
people in. Very cold to night. Started
to arrange picture letter for Blanche
Gillis.

March 14th

Sunday

Went to church service & to S. S. Did
some work on my picture letter. Nice
day but cool. Only Charlie, Margaret-
& Valeri' were at church so they did
not come up. Dorothy's birthday, 21st day
so we sang her up. Nice to hear

her sweet-voice. She says she is going
to do all kinds of things now she is 21.

March 15th - Mr. Caldwell still away. Did the
Monday entries in the morning and con-
tinued my picture letter. Then
Charles phoned for me to come down
and do some affidavits. When I
came home I proceeded with picture
letter. Wrote a note to be here at the
office. After dinner I shovelled for
a while. Snow was pretty big so
found a little was enough. If Charles
wants me he is to telephone for me.
Went down town about 5:00'clock. Duncan
came up after tea to see 'Lip'. His dad
is making an Irish window display.
Went to attic & got old Larp for Duncan.

March 16th - Worked for Charles. Then did my picture
Tuesday letter. Shovelled the rest of the side-
walk up to McConnell's. Mrs. M. a.
Hulliday called. Finished my letter.
Mr. & Mrs. Iner came up about a
quarter to ten for a little while.
Fine spring day. Thawing. Freezing & snowing
at night.

March 17th Did some office work. Cleaned up
Wednesday Dorothy's closet. When Charles came
home for dinner he had some work
he wanted finished in afternoon-train.
Did it. Went to Mrs. Lewis for lesson.
Called at office, M. A.'s office & let them
see my letter. Then called to see
Mrs. Litch. Mrs. Jefferson brought me
address for me to type. Mr. Caldwell
came up and we had a game of
seven-ups. Cold to-day - Snowing.
quite a storm for awhile.

March 18th Did some work for Charles. Cleaned up
Thursday my closet. Tipped some riddles for
Blanche and some poems (?) for
Jenna which I promised to send her.
~~Charles~~ Went up to Mother's to see her.
After tea went to church to social
evening held for saying farewell to
The Mr. Halliday family and the Gillies
family. Programme - Hymn, Scripture
Lesson, Duet Mrs. Carr & Mr. Workman (Violin
& piano) Speeches, Charles, M. A., Charles.
Prayer solo Mrs. Elworthy. Vocal Duet - Mrs.

Jess & Ruby Milne, Solo Mrs. Smellie,
Violin Solo - Sammy Steinberg. Eats -
Had a nice Social time & got home
about 11 o'clock. Write to Clara.

March 19th - Did some work for Charles. He went to
Friday. Tara on main line returning on
afternoon train. Got to be quite
blizzardy. Great fall of snow and all
the sidewalks has to be shovelled again.
Write an address (titles & songs) for
Blanche & Wilda Gillies who are to be
presented with organ songs at a
girls party to night. Went to Dr.
Bieber's at 3 p.m. Called at Mrs.
Leitch's Mrs. Carr's and Jess's.
Wrote to Dorothy. Had a letter from
her to-day saying she had just got
her hand out of splints - a few days
ago. Swore the ligaments but did not
say how.

March 20th - Did some work for Charles. Shovelled the
(Saturday) walk inside the garden, then, when I
had typed my letters, went out and
shovelled the sidewalk outside. Beautiful

day but still cold wind. Went down
to the office after dinner to bring up a
box of leaves which Will Paterson brought
in for us and which Charles forgot to
bring up at noon. Then went down again
to get some material for custom types and
arranged and cut them. Prædick and
Lynn. Alice and Margaret came up
with some cards and got a parcel to
take back with them. They stayed for
quite a little chat.

March 21st Went to Church twice to S. S. Beautiful
Sunday day. Charles was feeling very tired so
did not go to church at night. S. S. Teachers
meeting after S. S. which did not get out
until half past four. Mr. H. A. Halliday
gave us his resignation as superintendent
not accepted but is to be let out on
"bail" until September, as we are
short about 4 teachers now it seems
hard to see where the workers are to
come from. Charlie and Alice came
up after church. They had walked
out to Live's, Mrs Live is dead. to be
buried Monday.

March 22. Took 25-pages of shorthand. Went down
Monday) home for meat. Called to see Mrs. L. A.
Hulliday on the way home. She feels
last-week and sprained her
shoulder. Said it felt somewhat
better but she still has it in a sling.
Typed my letters - got through about
2 o'clock - (had dinner of course)
Called on Mrs. Wolford - who is ill and
also went to see Mr. & Mrs. Blair who
have both been ill. Mr. Blair still in
bed and Mrs. Blair went for a
short walk. Where sidewalk was
cleared. Went down to Charlie's store
and then came home and took
Mrs. Ryan's watch down to Coburn's
and got a new strap for it. Put
covers on 3 cushions after tea and
practised an hour during the day.
Wonderful display of Northern lights &
Mr. McDonald telephoned after 10 p.m. to
get quotation from "Edinburgh after-
shower" some time hunting it up
but got it. Springlike day. Wore my
spring coat for 1st time since I put
on my fur one.

March 23rd Did some work for Charles. Went down
Tuesday to get some meat. With-Corn Van Charles
and I finished taking snow off in
front of King's. L.R. Practised about half
an hour. Mrs. Caldwell and I went
down at 4 o'clock and bought a cut-
glass fern bowl presented to the
Muses (Rev & Mrs. Moore of Baptist-
Church) who are leaving for Georgetown.
The Hellaw Sheet-Gang met here and
then went to Biehn's where the Muses
and Caldwells had been invited
for the evening. I wrote an address
and typed it for the occasion. The
arrival of the gang was a great
surprise to the Muses. Had a
good time. Duncan was up in
the evening for awhile. Covered
2 cushions. Fine spring day.

March 24th Did the entries and a couple of
Wednesday probates for Charles. Mrs. Holford was
to leave on the Mon train for New
York to go into hospital. Likely to
have an operation. I called to see
if I could assist her but she did

Don't need any help. Covered 2
Cushions. Went - Mrs. Ann's for
my lesson. Miss Kitchner and
Mrs. Beattie called and Miss

Kitchner brought me some most-
delicious maple cream for writing
Horticulture paper for her. Practised
about an hour altogether. Dr. Beebe
has been appointed by Educational
Board of Windsor to do school work
so they will be leaving town. Sorry
to see them go. Wrote to Alma at
Guelph. Mr. & Mrs. Jones came up after
Prayer Meeting - Gave us some new
ideas about the worth of our Walnut-
furniture. Warm 5-day but cooler at-
night. Prepared story for Pearl Buckley's
composition (just outlined)

March 25th Did some work for Charles. Went down
Thursday. home for meat. Beautiful warm day.
The sidewalks are all cleaned but
the streets and crossings are very
dirty. Went out after dinner to go
up to Mrs. Harris but met Mrs. Ferguson
who told me she was in the store so I
had a chat with her there. Then went

to the Public Library and helped
Mrs. Ferguson sort Cards for ever and
long. Pearl Buckley called there (had
been up to the house) so I came up with
her and gave her the rules. Worked to
class, Dorothy and Nell.

March 26th - Warm day but got windy and much
Friday. cooler. Rained during the night and there
was one little shower during the day. Mrs.
Ryan went off on the early train. I
got up at 6 a.m. and, after seeing her
started, stayed up. Did some work for
Charles, did the work. Then went down
to the McDonald House for dinner. Mr.
& Mrs. M. A. Stalliday there also. When
I came home I did some more work
for Charles. Then went down to Charlie's
store and called on Mrs. Oliver who
just came back from Detroit last night.
Her sister died while she was down
there. Got tea ready and washed the
dishes. Mr. Moss was to come to cover the
Library work to night but did not show
up. I hope he comes along tomorrow as
I would like it done before D.A. comes home.

March 27th - Did some work for Charles. Did the work
(Saturday) at the house. Went down to the Donald House
for dinner and dined with Hallidays
again. Went down town in the afternoon
and then went over to Mr. H. Moss's to
see if he was coming to put down on
Couch. He was not in and, although I
left word, he has not shown up. Got
tea and washed the dishes. Duncan came
up for a while. Then Mrs. Beattie, Mrs.
Davey and Mrs. Kitchner came in
to talk over Horticultural Society with
Charles. Took their notes for them.

March 28th - Did not go to church in the morning
Sunday as it was 10 o'clock before we started
breakfast and I had the dishes to do.
Went to J. S. Blanche was away to
Hanover so I had all the work to-
day. Being Review Sunday Mr. Owen
gave an address on "The Forward
Movement." Had a touch of my old
pain so did not go to church but took
measures to try and get rid of it. Charles,
being very tired did not go either.
Alice and Margaret went to the Baptist

Church to hear Mrs. Moore sing and arrived
at the house before Charlie did who came
along later from the Presbyterian Church.
Thunder storm with quite bright lightning
and a great deal of wind.

March 29th - Very windy and quite cool. Did the
Monday clothes and the house work. Went to
dinner at the McDonald House and
dined with Holliday's again. Practised
an hour. Wrote to Dena. Mr. Farney
called to see about a band concert.
Kept me late getting tea. After tea Mr.
Cross came over to re-cover the library
couch. Cleared up the rest of the papers
that were under it. Mrs. Ryan got
home on the late train, very wet
& windy - Snowed at 6 o'clock and
throughout evening.

March 30th - Went down for meat. Got a table cloth
Tuesday, ready to leave. Wrote to Miss Small.
Just after dinner Mrs. Bell sang and
Kemp's whistle blew furiously - Very
windy & cold. It looked very serious
for a while but am glad to see they got

it out. Did some work for Charles.
Covered two Cushions. Wrote two
addresses - for Blanche & Wilda
Gillies - typed them and went
down town and got ribbon for
them - &c.

March 31st - Did some work for Charles. Hemmed
Wednesday one end of my table cloth. Went to
Mrs. Crow's for my lesson. Went to a
tea at Mrs. Beattie's - about 30 there.
Helped Mrs. Biehn, Mrs. Beattie and
Mrs. Kitchner serve the tea. Great
spread. When I got home Charles and
I went over to Mr. M. A.'s to say good
bye to Mr. & Mrs. Will Halliday who
leave tomorrow for Toronto. Mr.
W. Halliday came home with a
gold-headed cane presented to
him by the Agricultural Society.
Raining in afternoon & evening.

April 1st - Did some work for Charles in the
Thursday morning and went down town
before dinner for some Probate forms.
Did some more typing after dinner.

shopped to go to the station to say
good-bye to Anna Halliday. Came
back with Mrs. Leslie and Mrs. Dyer
who came in for awhile. Then finished
up my typing and took the book to
the office and did some shopping.
Left my picture letter at Mrs. Bickel's -
came home, having forgotten to call for it -
so went back down. Got supper
ready for Dorothy and Dr. Douglas Dickie
who are to arrive on the late train.
Wrote 14 post-cards (absurd ones labelled
"in, near, vicinity of Chesley, etc." to be
sent to Clara - the each mail till all
gone. Duncan was up for a couple of hours.
Went to train to meet Dorothy - left the
house when it was 50 minutes late.
Walked up and down the platform
with Charles $\frac{3}{4}$ of an hour before the
train arrived. Had some time finding
Dorothy and Doug in the crowd. They had
supper. Doug and Charles went to bed.
Helped Dorothy (who has her broken hand
in splints) to take a bath and we got
to bed about half past one. Quite
windy and cool.

April 22nd Good Friday. Raining hard in the
(Friday) morning. Hemmed the other end of the
table cloth. Prepared grapefruit for
breakfast for Dorothy and Doug who got
up about 10.30. Helped Dorothy throw
out and burn some of her old letters.
Hearing that Mrs. Holford's body had
arrived went over to the house to see
if I could do anything to help. Mrs.
Lawrence (Dorrie Cairns) was there.
Then went down to the maids and
Biehus to tell Mrs. Biehus Mrs. Holford
was dead (died after an operation for
gall stones. Performed by Dr. Middlebro
at O. Sound). Walked up and down
the walk for an hour with Charles.
Air fresh and energizing. Cleared
up cool. Practiced 1/2 an hour. Dorothy
and Doug went down to McDonald's
and Dorothy went to tea at Lynda
Simpson's. After tea Edna, Max, Jack
and Wat came up and the young
folks played bridge until 10.0'clock
when they went to a dance in
Biehus' Hall. Blizzaid at the time.
Wrote to Clare.

April 3rd. Did the entries for Charles. Helped Dorothy
Saturday make her sandwiches for a tea-dance.
Went down town for meat. Went to the
Public Library in the afternoon to help
Miss Elworthy as Mrs. Ferguson is away
to Toronto for Easter holidays. Dorothy had
Eva, Nan, Edna, Ida, Pearl, Roy, Douglas,
Harry, Wah; Wilfred Davison for a tea-
dance. Went back to Library after tea.
Bunny. Charles called and we went down
to Leitch's and got flowers to send to
Mrs. Wolford funeral. Came home and
after the young folks left - Ding and I
put up down and things away.
Oh, were my fur coat.

April 4th. Went to church twice and to Sunday
Sunday. School. Cold. wore my fur coat. Dorothy
and Ding only went in the morning.
Blanche Gillies' last Sunday. Mr.
Halliday presented her with a
"Book of Prayers". Dorothy and Ding went
over to Hellington King's after church
for a while. Charles and Alice were
up after church. Had skating in
Paisley rink on Saturday night.

April 5th - Did no entries for Charles. Went down
(Monday) lawn for meat. Lot of snow. Had to
shovel it as the broom was not
heavy enough. Fixed up my parcel
for Blanche Gillies. Dorothy and Douglas
went down lawn for a few minutes.
Ida Halladay and Ethel Reed are
to come up to play Bridge. Regular
snow storm this afternoon getting
colder at night. Got tea wagon ready
for Dorothy.

April 6th - Tank was empty in the bath-room.
Tuesday Charles turned on the hot water and
then could not turn it off. Went over
to McConnell's house to get Mr. McConnell
but found he had gone to the shore.
Got him by phone and he came up
and discovered that Charles had just
been turning the tap the wrong way.
The large tank was not empty but
something had gone wrong with the ball.
Mr. McConnell fixed it and I had
several trips to the attic to see that
Valve worked properly when the
tank was full. (Before all this) I got up

at 5.20 and went on to see the Gillies family of L.B.C. Cold - wore my fur coat. Went down town for meat - and to get a letter. As Charles was busy came home with the meat - and then went back. Still busy so came on home. In the afternoon - played table Solitaire with Dorothy and Douglas Nickle. Went down town before tea. Dorothy and Doug went to play Bridge at McDermott's. After tea went to the Public Library to help Miss Elworthy - no fun at all. Dorothy and Doug went to a dance in Hanover.

April 7th - Had a whole morning's work this Wednesday morning for Charles. Went down town in the afternoon for some lawn, lettuce etc. Practised an hour after tea. Dorothy and Doug have gone down to McDermott's. Regular blyssard from about 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. Quite a lot of snow has fallen.

April 8th - Did the entries. Went down town for meat. Thursday. Wrote to Clara, Nell and Frank. Dorothy

and Doug were at a tea at McDonald's. Eva has had friends visiting her. In the evening Doug was learning to play chess and then he and Dorothy went to a party at B. S. Halliday's. Mr. & Mrs. M. A. Halliday were over for about an hour. Still cold and stormy. Blizzards in flurries all day.

~~March~~ 9th Did the entries. Telephone out of order Friday. So I went to Mr. Beattie's telephone. Went down town with Dorothy in the afternoon. Took Doug's laundry to Kivong's and bought him some cigarettes. Went over to call on Jean Maxwell but found no one at home. In the evening the McDonalds and their friends and Wat-King were up playing bridge. Then they were to go to a dance in Biehn's Hall. Still cold but has stopped snowing. Wrote to Miss M^{rs} Vachon. Tipped some money for Doug.

april
March 10th - Did the entries and typed some poems
Saturday - for Doug. Went down town in the morning
for meat. Did some darning. Margaret -
Kastner arrived on the noon train from
Shatford to spend the week end. (Engaged
to Will McDonald) Went down to Dr. Bickner's
to have my bridge put in as he leaves
on Monday morning for Windsor. Then
went to Public Library as Mrs. Ferguson
not home yet. Went back after tea.
Jack Hill & Mrs. McDonald, with King
Harry & Ida Halladay came up to play
bridge. Helped get the sandwiches
ready when I got home.

april
March 11th - Dorothy, Doug, Charles and I went to church
Sunday. in the morning while Margaret stayed in
bed and had a sleep, cold day. Slept.
Went to S. S. Changed some of the classes
and so we were late getting home.
Will McDonald up calling in Margaret -
and Margaret went down there for tea.
Charles and I went to church at night.

april
March 12th - Dorothy and I went over to early hair to
Monday. see Douglas M. (Left up at 5:15.) Read

'The Family' by Elmon Glyn Whitbelungs
Margaret Kashner. Went down to Dr.
Biehn's office to get bridge ground off a
little. Donkey and I went down to
Mrs. Wilkes to see about her suit &
her other clothes. Margaret Kashner still
at Mr. Donald's and she and Mayorie
were going down to have their fortunes
told by the Medium, Muriel, who is
her with a Medicine Company. Typed
the entries and some slips for
the Organization Meeting of the
Agricultural Society. Very cold.
Went to the Armories

March 13². Cold day. Went down to Mr. Donald.

Anderson's to see if the woman she had hired could go. Did the entries. Went down town after dinner. Called on Mrs.

Leitch and Mrs. Snow. Did some work for Charles at home. Duncan was up after tea - wrote and typed an address for Mrs. Kitchner. Mrs. Day but still cool. Dorthy at a dance in B's Hall.

April 19th - Beautiful day. Practised at home Monday and a half. Went down to the post office at noon for the mail. Went down home in the afternoon. Wrote to Aunt Maggie (Dora died on the 9th and was buried on the 12th) and to Miss MacLachlan.

April 20th - Went down for meat in the morning. On Tuesday. The afternoon Dorothy and I went to call on Mrs. M. A. Halliday and Jean Bell. Did the entries for two days.

April 21st Raining & day. Went down in the
Wednesday. Morning for meat. Cleaned out the
China Closet - lower shelves and floor.
Did the entries and at noon had
three letters to write for Charles. Wasted
out some silk things for Dorothy. Then
went down home with her to do some
shopping. Did Dorothy's mending and
helped her pack her trunk after tea.
Spent some time in the attic hunting
for some of her letters. In the evening
Charlie, Tommy Ross and Charles
had meeting of Forward Movement
Committee. Mr. H. G. away - the
other members. Cleared up evl.

April 22nd Raining & warm. Went down home in
Thursday. In morning to get some lace to mend
Dorothy's night gown. Did some mending
for her when I came home. Did the
entries and some letters for Charles.
Went down home with Dorothy to do
some last odds & ends of shopping.
Closed her trunk & helped Mrs. Ryan
carry it down to the veranda. Went to
the station to see her off and then down

Went with Charles to get some stuff for
his new pygamas. Went to Clare.
Thunder storm at night - quite heavy.

April 23rd Did the entries. Cleaned out Dorothy's
Friday room. Went down town in the afternoon
and over to Mrs. Beattie's to show her
bouquet arranged for Miss Kichner.
(Artificial with about 8 different colored
ribbons on it.) Called at Mrs. Biehn's
(Mrs. Beattie called also) then we went
down and met Alice at Charlie's store
and all went to the McDonald House
in the evening where we had a very
jolly time and got home about 12 p.m.
Cold enough for a fur coat.

April 24th Did the entries, practiced 2 times.
Saturday. Still cold. Went down town in the
afternoon and did some shopping.
Then called at Library to do some
cataloging. Went down again about
a quarter to eight and finished up
that part of the work. Miss Pearce heard
her sister was ill and goes home
to night.

April 25th Still cool. Went to church twice and Sunday. to Church School. In the- went to her own church but- came over afterwards and stayed. We left her here when we went to Sunday School and she went to call on Mrs. Bisher and home before we got- back. After-church Mr. Inen, Charlie, M. A. & Alice came up. Alice had to go home because the babe would not go to sleep. The others- held a Forward Movement- Committee. I made them- leave.

April 26th Did the- entries. Charles did not- Monday. telephone for me in the- morning as no fire in the- office. Drove to Dorothy- class, Alma & Edgar Dask. Went to the- office for the- afternoon. Charles, Charlie, Mr. Davey and Mr. Inen started on a fishing trip to Golden Valley. Are to spend the- night at Cleypahant, go to Golden Valley in the- morning and get- back to- morning night. Mr. Levan the H. S. Inspector- was here to- day. He was a University friend of Charles' and called at the- office to see

him. Very sorry he came when Charles
going away so we could not have him
at the house. Practised our hymns in
the evening. Still cool.

April 27th - Went to the office to help Mr. Caldwell.
Tuesday. Worked until 10 o'clock. Mrs. Pearce
came home so I did not go back until
about 3.30 p.m. when I finished up. Went
to Mrs. Milne's to see about getting my
suit fixed. Mrs. Ryan and Mrs. Green
cleaned my room, spare room, Donkey's
room and upstairs hall today. In
the evening called with Mrs. Brathie
at Oliver's, Liebeck's and Mrs. (Rev)
Scott to get members for Horticultural
Society. Rained in the night and
several showers during the day. Some-
what warmer. Charlie had a letter from
Frank saying he was not any better
and could hardly keep going but charged
him not to tell mother or anyone.
Wrote to Mrs. Small. Charles telephoned
from Warrington at 11 p.m. to say they were
stuck with engine trouble and might not
get home until morning. Telephoned Alice.

and Mrs. Davey but - could get no answer to Inez's phone. Practised an hour and a half. (Duncan went fishing to.)

April 28th - Cold and Showery. Charles did not get home last night - but arrived on the early train. The engine is still misbehaving and Charlie, Mr. Davey and Duncan stayed in Stratton. Mr. Inez came home with Charles. Mrs. Green & Mrs. Ryan housecleaning again. Mr. McCormet cleaned and renewed shoe-pipes in nursery - did away with the old drum which has lasted us for so many years. Very nasty day - wind and cold rain. Practised an hour. Went down town with S. S. collection and deposited Mrs. Ryan's money in Bank of Hamilton. Got back as far as Davey's house then remembered that I had to bring home some soup so went back to Charlie's for it. Charles prosecuting Robt. Harper for theft of turkeys - Messrs Robertson & Shatt for defendants. All country interested and about 600 persons present at trial.

Went to Mrs. Cunn's for my lesson. After
tea cleaned the books in the library
and wrote a long letter for Charles.
Rained turned to snow - very cold.

April 29th Still housecleaning - Sewed up
Thursday. Seamed in couch cover and hemmed
it and looked over papers etc. in
library - Did entries and other
work for Charles. Snowed most of
morning but cleared up after dinner.
Sun shining but still cold. Dusted
lights in library, clock etc. Cleared up
papers, catch-alls and put back shells
and stones. Wrote to Dorothy and Clara
and took letters to post office. Came back
home and took back book and magazine
we had of Mr. Innes, book to Mr. Black.
And went in for a few minutes, and
some New York Times, styles up to Mrs.
Innes. Charles at High School Board
meeting. Innes out, much colder.
Practiced an hour.

April 30th Did some work for Charles. Went down for
Friday meat and Charles gave me some more

work at the office. Called at Mrs. M. A. Halliday's on the way home to give her Home Helpers' money. Wrote a note to Clara. In the afternoon - Called to see Mrs. Deumner's baby and also called at Mrs. Daise's. Regular Hellaw Street Gang at Deumner's as Mrs. Rogers, Mrs. Cruickshank, Mrs. Thomson and Mrs. Ewart - Called while I was there. Went on down town. Mrs. M. A. - Called after dinner to see Charles about vaquett for May 10th. (Forward Movement) Mother called while I was out - and Jessie Leslie and another girl called to see if I had any rollers downing slippers. (Sorry had none.) Practised about 20 minutes, after tea - went up to see Mother. Found Mrs. John Dobie there. Duncan came back with me to look at 'Life'. Wrote to Nell. Charles at Forward Movement Committee meeting. Still quite cool.

May 10th - Still very cool. Went down for meat. Did Saturday Some work for Charles. Duncan came up to repair the tennis markers. Had to

hunt up materials etc. for him. When Charles came home at noon he gave me another letter. Went down town in the afternoon and went into library to finish what cards I could. Brought the rest home with me and got them all sorted into classes. Duncan was up in the evening and Mrs. Beattie called to ask Charles and I to judge of mother sent in by school children for the Horticultural Society. Did my mending and darning after dinner.

May 2nd Sunday Did a visit for church. Went to church twice & to S. S. Got up at 7 a.m. as Charles and Mr. Halliday started for Inverness at 9 a.m. Mr. H. to later service. Charles to give an address re Forward Movement. After S. S. Went down to Mrs. Innes with some H. V. C. for her. Charles went to church at night and Alice, Alice Jean and Charlie came up after church. Was an eclipse of the moon. Cold.

May 3rd Monday Did the entries and a couple of letters. Started cleaning the attic. Hope to finish it

5-Monday. Went-down town-in the afternoon. Called at Mrs. Lohr's home at home. Worked to Dorothy and sent her two pairs of silk hose. Practised an hour and twenty minutes. Three sore teeth. Charles out all evening. Still very cold.

May 4th - Teeth-still sore - still cold. Did the Tuesday entries. Went-down town for treat. Put-away Dorothy's and my own fur coats in bags. Went-down town-in the afternoon. practised over an hour. Charles went to Soldiers' Memorial meeting after tea.

May 5th - Mrs. Green and Mrs. Ryan cleaning Wednesday. Drawing room to-day. Fine spring day. Really quite warm but-wind cool. Did the entries. Teeth-still sore. Dusted dishes, etc., put-back things on pianos, tables etc., & dusted them. Stanley Renthien, who is home from St. Pauls for a day or so, called and spent-a couple of hours with me. He has certainly seen "Life" since he

Has been floating around the U.S. & has decided to stay put now and start at something in earnest - my boy Stan! Went down to Mrs. Cunniff to tell her why I could not go for my lesson. Called on Mrs. Litch to show her snaps I got - from Alma in her letter from Guelph. After tea called at Lewis to see if Veterans would have me. McKays for 17th or 18th May. Not possible. Went to Band Concert to hear me. Bungt. Went up to stage afterwards & was introduced to him. Mrs. McDonald told me that Tony Nickle told Will me so. and will told her that Donny had got her hair bobbed. I am very sorry. It seems a pity. Recd 4 pairs Shes from Natural Bread in approval.

May 6th - Beautiful spring day. Did Re-entree Sunday. And a couple of letters. Went down town for treat and called at Bank of Hamilton to get information for class. Took some cream & borel over to Hoppers for aldy. Mrs. Barrett there. Stayed and gossiped awhile. Returned Shes received from Natural Bread as Arch to Lou.

When I was over at Harper's Joints
rang me up on the phone but I
never found out who wanted me
although I surmised it was Dory. Nickle.
Wrote to Clare and Mrs. Ingers. Went
down to see rehearsal of Miss
Mence's boys in "Business is Business".
Went in down to office with Miss
Bridgman (as far as Chris) she is training
8 girls for a dance. After tea went up
to see Mother who goes to Joints in
the morning. Charles went with me.

May 7th - Beautiful warm spring day. Went
Friday. to early train to see Mother - J. Mrs.
Milburn was going to Joints, too.
Came back in the car with Charlie.
Did the entries and a couple of
letters. Went down town and got
my oxfords from Mr. Davis's.
Practised about half an hour.
At 2 o'clock Mr. Davis telephoned asking
for an address for Mrs. Arch. McKean.
(They are leaving town this week.) Was
rather cross about it - as I had so
many things to do. Wrote it, typed it,

went to the office and bonded it - and
got ribbon for it - at Charlie's. Went
to rehearsal - "Business is Business".
Called at home - no one at home. Mrs.
Ives called for address. Went to Mrs.
Messer's Recital - was surprised to find
the Hall filled. Programme good. Boys

May 8th - Had a shampoo. Did the entries. Went

so lay down for awhile at noon and
came home about-twenty minutes
to 6 and rested until he went to
the station to meet Mr. J. A. Patterson,
N.C. who speaks in church to-morrow
on Forward Movement and who is
to stay with us. Drains about 20 miles lake.

May 9th - Got up about-a quarter-to seven.
Sunday Had breakfast-at 9 a.m. Went to
Church - enjoyed Mr. Patterson's
address on the Forward Movement-
very much but he spoke too long.
Some of the people could not hear. Went
to S.S. (Had three meals on Mr.
Patterson's account) nice warm
day. Charles went to Anglican
Church in evening to speak so I
went to church with Mr. Patterson.
After church we went to Dr. A.'s.
Mr. and Mrs. Zuer and Mr.
Patterson along. Mr. Patterson's address
at night better as he spoke out well.
Came home to find a flood. The
small tank had been leaking a

little. It suddenly determined to leak
in earnest. Mopped up bath-room -
put pails down in scullery and then
we went to the attic shut off the water
from the upper tank and allowed the
small tank to empty. Hope the
new tank will be in soon. Miss the water.
Got to bed about midnight.

May 10th - Did the entries and wrote the letter.
Monday Went to the church to help Charlie
and Charles put-up flaps. Put-up
a triangle of flaps above class rooms.
Had to come up home for 3 of our flaps.
Charlie came up here for dinner.
I spent the afternoon running

take her place and help Mrs. Coburn
at their table. Came home and got
my tea and went back and
waited on the table. The school room
and tables looked very nice. Banquet
a success only not as many there as
were expected. Mr. Armstrong gave a

very fine address. He came back from China with Sweet-Dickson and they are very highly of her. At the close of the banquet Mr. Jno. Oswald and Mr. J. C. Milne announced their intention of giving \$500 each. Called into doors on the way home to deliver part of their goods we carried up.

May 11th - Went down town for treat and to Tuesday get my expnd stretched. Went up to school room with Charlie to take down flags and then to office for parcels. my lesson. Went down for my lesson.
Wrote another letter for Charles after
tea.

May 13th - Went down Linn for meat. Called at -
Thursday. Mrs. Green's to pay her for housecleaning
and at Mrs. Beattie's. Out - out. Typed
28 Forward Movement letters for
Charles who went out to Peter -
McDermish's with Mr. Halliday to canvas
for Forward Movement. Went to Clare
and Frank. Practised $\frac{1}{2}$ an hour. Very
cool at night. Had to wear Dr. Thompson's fur
when I went down at 9 p.m. to post my
letters and could feel the cold through
my coat. G.A. telephone message from
Rockwood that Mrs. Joliffe is dead. Charles
went to Preparatory Service.

May 14th - Did a second copy list for Forward
Friday Movement - canvassers. Went to office to

get-them-posted. Delivered to A. Halliday's, W. J. Ross', Charles's, Mr. Ewart's, Mrs. Dolphin's, Mr. Milne's and then went around to Coburn's house with his. Practised an hour. Went down town in the afternoon. Called to see Mrs. Caldwell who goes to Walkersham Hospital on Monday for an operation. (So going over Sunday morning.) After tea had to write a couple of letters for Charles. Mr. Diddle's called to leave his Forward Movement Cards.

May 15th
Saturday

Charles went to Rockwood on the early train to Mrs. Joliffe's funeral. Did my mending. Went down town in the afternoon and knit a few rows on Edythe Hopper's sweater while I was in the store. Duncan came up after tea and Charles got home on late train. Tuesday. Charles met a lot of old family friends in Rockwood. Heard that his grandfather and grandmother were present at the organization of the London Missionary Society. The paper at the factory met with the first last night.

May 18th - Mrs. McGregg ill so she did not come
Monday. after saying she would be here which
made Mrs. Ryan late with the washing.
Went down town for meat in the
morning. Elmer, Victor and Douglas
Caldwell were here for dinner as their

operation. Real spring day but looks like
rain. Mr. Hubbell came up this morning
and put the new lathe in the attic.

May 21st - Wrote a letter for Charles. Went down
Friday for meat. Wrote to Frank. Ripped my
autocracy gown and my red dress.
Went over to Mrs. Milne's with the new
York Times. Went down town. In the
evening Mr. Caldwell came up for
some seeds. Then Mr. Kellerman
came over as he and Charles are the
Committee for floats for the 3rd of June.
Charlie, Alice, Duncan and Bill came
up to see the new tent and arrange

May 22nd Went down town to see about getting my

May 23rd Fine day. in the morning. Went to Sunday Church here and to S. S. Rained in the afternoon. Mr. & Mrs. Dyer came up after S. S. to see the tulips. after church at night Mrs. Beattie and I went for a walk. Then she came in and I divided up my seeds with her. Charlie, Duncan, Margaret and Alice went to Elliphaunt this morning for the 24th. Duncan & Charlie to paint the cottage - Alice & Margaret to clean it.

May 24th Got up at 5.30 a.m. Left at 7 for Brussels. Monday Party - Mr. H. J. Ross, Charles, myself and

Mr. Beattie driving. When we got to Walkeburn
went to the green house and ordered
geraniums, Salvia etc. and got some
roses for Mrs. Caldwell. Then went up to
the hospital to see Mrs. Caldwell. Took
her the roses and a book. Found her

Charlie, Duncan & Alice came up in the

evening and the new tent - was put up to see how it looked. a few holes & several patches discovered. Mrs. Beattie came over with some seeds and the Horticultural float - was discussed. Mrs. Cunn in doubt so no lesson.

May 27th

Thursday

Knee quite sore. Mr. Dyer came up to see the tent and I went around the garden with him to get artichokes, sorrel & cress. Went to bank with S.S. Collection and Mr. Ryan's and Jimmy's deposits. Helped Charles take the tent down. Wrote to Clare. Just heard from aunt Maggie that Dora committed suicide & Charlie phoned that Mr. Engel died this morning at 5:00 clock. At 6:30 p.m. Charlie and Alice came along in the car and we left for Hannover. Called first at Engel's. Saw Jack, Mrs. Dwykes, Dr. Engel, Mrs. Engel, Duncan and Mrs. Ball. Mrs. Engel seemed quite dazed. Mr. Engel had been ill for 9 weeks with rheumatism. Then had pleurisy and finally the fluid on the lungs filled the heart. Dorothy got home on
