Slept outside until 26 late

March 5th Wind changed in the night. Windows Friday covered with frost again and quite a fall of snow. Did some work for Charles. Then cut out pictures, at the same time clearing out shelf under couch.

Went down town in the afternoon and shovelled the walk when I came home. (was at it half an hour) after reading the Globe and the Enterprise continued cut out work. It got quite stormy. Mr Schmidt said it was the stormiest day this winter out in the country but I fancy he has forgotten some of the storms. Bad day however. Went to Dorothy's, carnival last night, tried But-Lemke's lead dress. Slept outside

March 6th Worked all morning for Charles. (Saturday). Mr Caldwell still confined to the house. Continued 'cut-out' work. Fine, bright day but still very frosty. Went down town in the afternoon after tea Dr. Reichen came up to see Charles re Hat for Miss V. Halladay. Continued cut-out work. Cold so slept inside. Have a bad cold.

March 7th Still cold but bright. Church square (Sunday) b-day. Went to church and b.s.b. Did not go to church at night as I had neuralgia in my head. Quite stormy

when we came home from school.
Meeting after-S. S. to discuss Graded helps.
Not considered very feasible. Mrs. S., Ella
Lukian, Irene Halliday, C. Pollard, Mr. J. M.
and myself are to meet at our house
to-morrow night and try and re-arrange
classes upstairs. Went to Coles re box
for Dorothy's birthday. Played Re-piano
for an hour. Charlie and Alice came
up after-church. Very windy so shall
sleep in side.

March 8th Charles left for Walkerton - on the
(Monday) early train. Blocked and did
not leave until about 8:20. Mrs.
Ryan made a mistake and called
him at 5:15 a.m. He had mixed
up his watch in setting it to, and
came in at 7:15 to know the time
so altogether he had a disturbed
night. Did some work that Charles
left for me. Went to Miss McNaughton
for Mrs. M. Gwynn. Then went down
with my work. Very stormy. Had a
letter from Frank asking for in-
formation in regard to relatives in

Victoria & Vancouver. Went into the office and answered it at once as I think wanted to before he leave California (about 15th) came home & I hurried out the walk. Had a S.S. meeting & change classes etc. Irene Halliday, Ella McLean, Connie Pollard, Mr. & Mrs. Inez here. Had sandwiches & coffee for them. Duncan was here for an hour before they came looking at "Life". Train canceled. Had telephone message from Hanover where the men, Charles, Dr. Biehn & Dr. Halliday (His Canadian the West) have to stay all night. Very stormy day. Slept inside.

March 9th ^{Tuesday} Much milder today. Charles ^{Monday} drove up from Hanover and got here a few minutes before 11. Came home to dinner but had to hurry back to Division Court as train got in about one o'clock instead of at 4:30 as reported at Hanover would be the case. Yesterday morning hair

is reported off the track up north -
Eva McDonald, ready to go to Toronto,
and Ida Halladay, going to Achonwy
to visit Ethelyn, etc - are stranded
here until there is a train. Did
some shorthand, some French & some
memory work. Practiced two hours alto-
gether. Went up to see brother - cold but
storming when I came home. Judge
Grey came up for tea and while he
was here I did part of an initial on
my dresser cover. Slept outside

March 10th - Did some work for Charlie. Went
Wednesday down town to Mrs. Lewis for my music lesson.
Came home and shovelled snow for
an hour. Eva Mrs. McDonald and
Pearl Buckley called - Pearl was
returning a book she borrowed.
Practiced for an hour altogether &
did some short-hand & French.
Have moved outside to sleep. Not today.

March 11th - Did some work for Charles. Got my
Thursday S. S. orders ready and went down
to the bank with Mum. Mr. Luer came

Up at 11 a.m. and we arranged to start a new Cradle Roll. Went out and shovelled snow for an hour. Wrote to Dorothy and Clark. Practiced 3/4 of an hour. Duncan came up in the evening and we played seven-ups. Was 11 p.m. when he went home. He owed me 30 sticks of timber - Charles was reduced to 5 and I having 78, had increased my capital more than threefold. Rained in night. 1st rain since November.

March 12th

Friday. Rather a jubilation in the bathroom this morning as it rained in night and tank half full. Had a red bath and a shampoo. Was busy until 1 o'clock with office work. Wrote to Nell and a birthday letter to Dorothy who will be 21 years old on Sunday. I sent her \$10 and her dad sent her \$15. Rainy at least. Showery day. Roads are impassable. At m. Peter Kincaid's funeral, which is 5-day, ReSteigh

Charles could not get out & it would be
drawn by men. I shovelled snow for
an hour. Had to write a note for
Free Press for Charles & type it after tea.
Freezing at night.

March 13rd

Saturday Very cold to-day. Did the entries then,
as Mr. Caldwell is away (to Hamilton to
visit a friend & have his eyes tested).
Charles telephoned me and I went to the
office & got some work and came home to
do it on my own typewriter. Did my
darning and mending (at noon &
after tea). Went to the office for the after-
noon but did not get a chance to
get much work as there were so many
people in. Very cold to-night. Started
to arrange picture letter for Blanche
Gillies.

March 14th Went to church twice & to S. S. Did
Sunday. Some work on my picture letter. Nice
day but cool. Only Charlie, Margaret -
Valerie Jean at church so they did
not come up. Dorothy's birthday, 21 to-
day so we sang her up. Nice to hear

her sweet voice. She says she is going
to do all kinds of things now she is 21.

March 15th Mr. Caldwell still away. Did the
Monday entries in the morning and con-
tinued my picture letter. Then
Charles joined for me to come down
and do some affidavits. When I
came home I proceeded with picture
letter. Wrote a note to G. L. Lee at the
"Y.W.C.A." after dinner shovelled for
a while. Snow was pretty heavy so
I found a little was enough. Charles
wants me to go to telephone for me.

Went down town about 5. o'clock. Duncan
came up after tea was 'off'. His dad
is making an Irish window display.
Went to attic & got old Larp from Duncan.

March 16th Worked for Charles. Then did my picture
Tuesday letter. Shovelled the rest of the side-
walk up to McConnell's. Am. 11 a.
Halliday called. Finished my letter.
Mr. & Mrs. Lee came up about a
quarter to ten for a little while.
Fine spring day. Morning. Freezing & snowing
at night.

March 17th Did some office work. Cleaned up Wednesday Dorothy's closet. When Charles came home from dormies he had some work he wanted finished in afternoon - hair. Did it. Went to Mrs. Lewis for lesson. Called at office, Dr. A.'s office & let them see my letter. Then called to see Mrs. Litch. Mrs. Ferguson brought me address for me to type. Mr. Caldwell came up and we had a game of Seven-ups. Cold today. Snowing. Quite a storm for awhile.

March 18th Did some work for Charles. Cleaned up Thursday day closet. Tipped some riddles for Blanche and some poems (?) for Ferna which I promised to send her. Charles went up to Mother to see her after tea went to church to social evening held for saying farewell to the Mr. Halliday family and the Gillies family. Programme - Hymn, Scripture lesson, Duet from Mrs. Workman (Violin & piano) Speeches, Charlie, Dr. A., Charles - pictures solo from Elmerthy. Vocal duet - Mrs.

Lucie & Ruby Milne, solo bass Smellie,
Violin solo - Sammy Steinberg. Etc.
Had a medical time & got home
about 11 o'clock. Wrote to Clarence.

March 19th Friday Did some work for Charles. He went to
Tara on Mon evening returning on
afternoon train. Got to be quite
blizzardy. Great fall of snow and all
the sidewalks had to be shovelled again.
Wrote an address (titles of songs) for
Blanche & Wilda Gillies who are to be
presented with original songs at a
girls party to-night. Went to Dr.
Biehler's at 3 p.m. Called at Mrs.
Litch's, Mrs. Curr's and Zue's.
Wrote to Dorothy. Had a letter from
her 5-day saying she had just got
her hand out of splints - a few days
ago. Some ligaments - but did not
say how.

March 20th Saturday Did some work for Charles. Shovelled the
walk inside the garden, then, then I
had typed my letters, went out and
shovelled the sidewalk outside. Beautiful

day but still cold wind. Went down
the office after dinner to bring up a
jar of cream which Will Peterson brought
in for us and which Charles forgot to
bring up at noon. Then went down again
to get some natural freshening soap - and
arranged and cut them. Preached all
morning. Alice and Margaret came up
with some carrots - and got a parcel to
take back with them. They stayed for
quite a little chat.

March 21st Went to church twice & to S. S. Beautiful
Sunday day. Charles was feeling very tired so
did not go to church at night. S.S. Teacher's
Meeting after S. S. which did not get out
until half past four. Mr. H. A. Halliday
gave in his resignation as superintendent
not accepted but is to "be let out on
bail" until September, as we are
short about 4 teachers now it seems
hard to see where the workers are to
come from. Charlie and Alice came
up after church. They had walked
out to Lovers, Mrs. Love is dead. To be
buried Monday.

March 22. Took 25-pages of shorthand. Went down Monday to town for meat. Called to see Mrs. H. A. Halliday on the way home. She fell last week and sprained her shoulder. Said it felt somewhat better but she still has it - in a sling. Dipped my letters - got through about 2 o'clock - (had dinner of course) called on Mrs. Holton - who is ill and also went to see Mr. & Mrs. Blair who have both been ill. Mr. Blair still in bed and Mrs. Blair went for a short walk. There sidewalk was cleared. Went down to Charlie's shore and then came home and took Mrs. Ryan's watch down to Cobean's and got a new strap for it. Put covers on 3 cushions after tea - and practised an hour during the day. Wonderful display of Northern lights & Mr. McDonald telephoned after 10 p.m. to get quotation from "Edinburgh After Holden" Some time hunting it up but got it. Springlike day. Wore my spring coat for 1st time since I put on my fur one.

March 23rd Did some work for Charles. Went down Tuesday to get some meat. With cow bar Charles and I finished taking some off in front of King's L.R. Practised about half an hour. Mrs. Caldwell and I went down at 4 o'clock and bought a cut-glass fern bowl & presented it to Mr. & Mrs. (Rev & Mrs. Moore of Baptist Church) who are leaving for Georgetown. The Mayaw Sheet-Gang met here and then went to Biehle's where the Moores and Caldwells had been invited for the evening. I wrote an address and typed it for the occasion. The arrival of the gang was a great surprise to the Moores. Had a good time. Duncan was up in the evening for awhile. Covered 2 cushions. Fine spring day.

March 24th Did the entries and a couple of Wednesday probates for Charles. Mrs. Holford was to leave in the noon train for Coney Island to go into hospital. Likely to have an operation. I called to see if I could assist her but she did

Int need any help. Covered 2
Cushions. Went - Wm's. am's for
my lesson. Miss Krichner and
Mrs. Beattie called and Miss
Krichner brought me some most
delicious Maple cream for writing
horticultural paper for her. Practised
about an hour altogether. Dr. Bieber
has been appointed by Educational
Board of Windsor to do School work.
So they will be leaving soon. Sorry
to see them go. Wrote to Alma at
Guelph. Mr. & Mrs. Tuer came up after
Prayer meeting - Gave us some new
ideas about the worth of our valent
furniture. Warm to-day but cooler at
night. Prepared story for Pearl Buckley's
composition (not written)

March 25th Did some work for Charles. Went down
Thursday. Home for meat. Beautiful warm day.
The sidewalks are all cleaned but
the sheets and crossings are very
dirty. Went - mt - after dinner to go
up to Mrs. H. but met Mrs. Ferguson
who told me she was in the store - so I
had a chat with her there; then went

to the Public Library and helped
Mrs. Ferguson sort cards for over an
hour. Pearl Buckley called there (had
been up to the house) so I came up with
her and gave her the news. Wrote to
Clare, Dorothy and Nell.

March 26th Warm day but still windy and much
colder. Rained during the night and there
was one little shower during the day. Mrs.
Ryan went off on the early train. I
got up at 6 a.m. and after seeing her
start, stayed up, did some work for
Charles, did the work. Then went down
to the Mr. Donald home for dinner. Mr.
and Mrs. H. A. Stallday were also. When
I came home I did some more work
for Charles. Then went down to Charles's
store and called on Mrs. Oliver who
just came back from Toronto last night.
Her sister died while she was down
there. Got tea ready and washed the
dishes. Mr. Moss was to come to cover the
Library couch last night but did not show
up. I hope he comes along to-morrow as
I would like it done before it comes home.

March 27th Did some work for Charles. Did the work (Saturday) at the house. Went down over Donald House for dinner and dined with Hallidays again. Went down here in the afternoon and then went over to Mr. H. Morris's to see if he was coming to put over on Cuth. He was not in and, although I left word, he has not shown up. Got tea and washed the dishes. Duncan came up for awhile. Then Mrs. Beattie, Mrs. Davy and Mrs. Kirchner came in to talk over Horticultural Society with Charles. Took their notes for them.

March 28th Did not go to church in the morning Sunday as it was 10 o'clock before we started breakfast - and I had the dishes to do. Went to S. S. Blanche was away to Hanover so I had all the work to day. Being Review Sunday Mr. Duer gave an address on "The Forward Movement." Had a touch of my old pain so did not go to church but took measures to try and get rid of it. Charles being very tired did not go either. Alice and Margaret went to the Baptist

Church & hear Mrs. Moore sing and arrived
at the house before Charlie did who came
along later from the Presbyterian church.
Thunder storm with quite bright lightning
and a great deal of wind.

March 29th - Very windy and quite cold. Did the
Monday errands and the house work. Went to
dinner at the McDonald House and
dined with Holliday's again. Practised
on horn. Worked down. Mr. Farney
called to see about a band concert.
Kept me late - getting tea. After tea Mr.
Bross came over to re-cover the library
couch. Cleared up the rest of the papers
that were under it. Mrs. Ryan got
home on the late train, very cold
& windy - snowed at 6 o'clock and
throughout evening.

March 30th - Went down for meat. Got a table cloth
Tuesday ready to hem. Worked more
just after dinner. Fire bell rang and
King's Whistle blew furiously - very
windy & cold. It looked very severe
for awhile but am glad to see they got

it out. Did some work for Charles. Covered hot cushion. Wrote two addresses - for Blanche & Wilda Gilles - typed them - and went down town and got ribbon for them - etc.

March 31st Did some work for Charles. Hemmed Wednesday one end of my table cloth - Went to Mrs. Cow's for my lesson. Went to tea at Mrs. Beattie's - about 30 here. Helped Mrs. Biehn, Mrs. Beattie and Mrs. Kuehner serve the tea. Great spread - When I got home Charles and I went over to Mr. M. A.'s to say good bye to Mr. & Mrs. Will Halliday who leave tomorrow for Toronto. Mr. W. Halliday came home with a gold-headed cane presented to him by the Agricultural Society. Raining in afternoon & evening.

April 1st Did some work for Charles in the Thursday morning and went down town before dinner for some private forms. Did some more typing after dinner.

Shipped bags to the station to say
good-bye to Anna Halliday. Came
back with Miss Leslie and Mrs. Lee
who came in for awhile. Then finished
up my typing and took the work to
the office and did some shopping.
Left my picture letter at Mrs. Bichis -
came home, having forgotten to call for it -
so went back down. Got supper
ready for Dorothy and Mr. Douglas Miller
who are to arrive on the late train.
Wrote 14 post-cards (absurd trains labelled
in, near, vicinity of Chealey, etc.) to be
sent to Clare - the each mail till all
gone. Duncan was up for a couple of hours.
Went to have Street-Dorothy - left the
house when it was 50 minutes late -
walked up and down the platform
with Charles 3/4 of an hour before the
train arrived. It had some time finding
Dorothy - and dug in the card. They had
supper. Dorothy and Charles went to bed.
Helped Dorothy - (who has her broken hand
in splints) to take a bath - and we got
to bed about half past one. Quite
windy and cool.

April 2nd Good Friday. Raining hard on the
(Friday) morning. Hemmed the other end of the
table cloth. Prepared grapefruit for
breakfast for Dorothy and Doug who got
up about 10.30. Helped Dorothy throw
out and burn some of her old letters.
Hearing that Mrs. Holford's body had
arrived went over to the house to see
if I could do anything to help. Mrs.
Lawrence (Dorothy's cousin) was there.
Then went down to the maine and
Biehns & tell Mrs. Biehn Mrs. Holford
was dead (died after an operation for
gall stones. Performed by Dr. Middlebrooks
at O. Sound) Walked up and down
the walk for an hour with Charles.
air fresh and energizing - cleared
up cold. Practiced 1/2 an hour. Dorothy
and Doug went down to McDonald's
and Dorothy went to tea at Lynda
Simpson's. After tea - Edna, Mar. Jack
and Wal - came up and the young
folks played bridge until 10.0 o'clock
then they went to a dance in
Biehn's Hall. Blizzard at the time.
Wish to close.

April 13rd. Did the entries for Charles. Helped Dorothy Saturday make her sandwiches for a tea-dance. Went down town for meat. Went to the Public Library in the afternoon to help Miss Elvorthly as Mrs. Ferguson is away to Toronto for Easter holidays. Dorothy had Eva, Max, Edna, Ida, Pearl, Roy, Douglas, Harry, Walt, Wilfred Dawson for a tea-dance. Went back to library after tea. Busy. Charles called and we went down to Leitch's and got flowers to send to Mrs. Holford funeral. Came home and after the young folks left Doug and I put things down and things away. Odd, were they for coast.

April 4th. Went to church twice and to Sunday School. Cold, wore my fur coat. Dorothy and Doug only went in the morning. Blanche Gillies' last Sunday. Mr. Halliday presented her with a "Book of Praise". Dorothy and Doug went over to Wellington Kings after church for awhile. Charlie and Alice were up after church. Had skating at Paisley rink on Saturday night.

April 5th - Did the entries for Charles. Went down (Monday) town for meat. Lot of snow. Had to shovel it as the brownie was not heavy enough. Tidied up my parcel for Blanche Gillies. Dorothy and Douglas went down town for a few minutes. Ida Halladay and Ethel Reed are to come up to play Bridge. Regular snow storm this afternoon - getting colder at night. Got the wagon ready for Dorothy.

April 6th - Taube was empty in the bath room. Tuesday Charles turned on the hot water and there could not turn it off. Went over to Mr. Combel's house to get Mr. Combel but found he had gone to the shore. Got him by phone and he came up and discovered that Charles had just been turning the tap the wrong way. The large tank was not empty but something had gone wrong with the ball. Mr. Combel fixed it and I had several trips to the attic to see that valve worked properly when the tank was full. (Before all this) I got up

at 5.20 and went over to see the Gillies family off to B.C. Gold - time my first count. Went down town for meat - and to get a letter. As Charles was busy came home with the meat - and then went back. Still busy so came on home. In the afternoon - played little Solitaire with Dorothy and Douglas Nickle. Went down town before tea - Dorothy and Doug went to play Bridge at McDonald's. After tea went to the Public Library to help Miss Elmhurst - no fire at all. Dorothy and Doug went to a dance in Hanover.

April 7th - Had a whole morning's work this Wednesday morning for Charles. Went down town in the afternoon for some laundry, lettuce etc. practiced an hour after tea. Dorothy and Doug have gone down to the McDonald's. Regular blizzard from about 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. Quite a lot of snow has fallen.

April 8th - Did the entries. Went down town for meat. Thursday. Work to Clare, Nell and Frank. Dorothy

and Doug were at-a-ha-at McDonald's.
Eva has had friends visiting her. In
the evening Doug was learning to play
chess and then he and Dorothy went
to a party at B. S. Halladay's. Mr. &
Mrs. Mr. a. Halliday were over for
about an hour. still cold and
stormy. Blizzards in flurries all
day

april
March 9th Did the entries. Telephone out of order
Friday. so I went to Mr. Beattie's telephone.

Went down town with Dorothy in the
afternoon. Took Doug's laundry to
Kroger's and bought him some
cigarettes. Went over to call on
Jean Maxwell but found no one
at home. In the evening the
McDonalds and their friends and
Wat-King were up playing bridge.
Then they were off to a dance in
Biehn's Hall. Still cold but has
stopped snowing. Wrote to Miss
McGraham. Dipped some power for Doug.

April
March 10th Did the entries and typed some poems
Saturday - Friday. Went down town in the morning
for meat. Did some darning. Margaret -
Kashur arrived on the 20th having from
Shaford to spend the week end. (Engaged
to Will McDonald) Went down to Dr. Bicker's
to have my bridge put in as he leaves
on Monday morning for Windsor. Then
went to Public Library as Mrs. Ferguson
was home yet. Went back after tea.
Jack Hill & son McDonald, 221 King
Harry & Ida Halladay came up to play
bridge. Helped get the sandwiches
ready then I got home.

April
March 11th Dorothy, Ding, Charles and I went to church
Sunday in the morning while Margaret stayed in
bed and had a sleep. Cold day - Sleet.
Went to S. S. Changed some of the classes
and so we were late getting home.
Will McDonald up calling in Margaret -
and Margaret went down there for tea.
Charles and I went to church at night.

April
March 12th Dorothy and I went over to early train to
Monday. See Douglas p. (I got up at 5:15.) Read

'The Family' by Eleanor Glyn White belongs
Margaret Kashner. Went down to Dr.
Biehn's Office to get bridge ground off a
little. Dorothy and I went down to
Mrs. Wilcox's to see about her suit &
her other clothes. Margaret Kashner still
at McDonald's and she and Mayorie
were going down to have their fortunes
told by the medium, Muriel, who is
here with a medicine company. Typed
the entries and some slips for
the organization meeting of the
horticultural society. Very cold.
Went to the armories.

April
March 13rd Cold day. Went down McDonald.
Tuesday. House to get a hat from Mr. Boyd.
Selected a plain black one with
fawn straw facing. Got the meat
and came home. Did the entries
for Charles. Wrote to Doug Nickley (to
thank him for a dozen beautiful
roses he sent me yesterday)
Alma Halliday, Mrs. Ward, Aunt
Maggie and Blanche Gillies.
Mayorie McDonald and Margaret

Kashner came up in the afternoon. Went down town about 5:30 for a walk. As Mrs. Ferguson did not get home I went to Library & help Mrs. Elmhurst. Dorothy went to McDonald's and to the Bijou and Charles was at a Forward Movement Committee meeting. I got home first.

April 14th Had a good deal of typing to do. Went Wednesday down town for meat. Cleaned out Library closet. Went up to see Mother and hearing Mrs. Mc Gregor was sick I called to see her also. Somewhat warmer but still quite cool.

April 15th - Cleaned out the drawers in the ^{still cool.} Thursday Library desk. Went down town in the afternoon. Margaret Kashner and Mrs. McDonald were up for awhile. Walked up and down the walk for awhile. Did the entries and a letter for Charles at noon and did a letter for him after tea. Dorothy is spending the evening at McDonald's. Uncle & Clara, Nell, Mrs. Anderson (Johns-McGregor) and Edgar dark who is in Speedwell Hospital.

Mrs. Clifton came to-day for his first-day in the garden this season.

April 16th.

Friday

Went down for meat in the morning.

Mrs. Park took sick and the Misses Anderson are left all alone - one blind and the other almost blind - Went to see if Mrs. Russell could go out & look after them - Then went to Mrs.

Anderson's to see if the woman she had come to. Did the entries. Went down town after dinner. Called on Mrs.

Leitch and Mrs. Cow. Did some work for Charles at noon. Duncan was up after tea - wrote and typed an address for Mrs. Kichner. This day hot - still cool. Dorothy at a dance in B's Hall.

April 17th did the entries. Went down town for Saturday meat. Nice day - somewhat warmer.

Did Dorothy's mending and also other mending. Went down town and called in Library and did some work for Mrs. Ferguson. In the evening Alice, Margaret, Mary & Margaret Stevens called & Alice & Margaret brought me a pair of

Cases and some crocheted doilies for
a birthday present. Then Duncan
brought me a box of chocolates. Mrs.
Ferguson gave me a box, too, which she
brought from Toronto.

April 18th Beautiful day. Went to church in the
morning and W.S. Charles went to
the Baptist Church at night and
Dorothy and I stayed at home. Dor-
went down to McDonald's about 8 p.m.
Charlie and Alice ^{Margaret} came up after
church.

April 19th Beautiful day. Practiced an hour
Monday and a half. Went down to the
post office at noon for the mail.
Went down home in the afternoon.
Wrote to aunt Maggie (Dora died
on the 9th and was buried on the

April 20th Went down for treat in the morning. On

April 21st Raining & day. Went down in the

went down town with her to do some
shopping. Did Dorothy's mending and
helped her pack her trunk after tea.
Spent some time in the attic hunting
for some of her letters. In the evening
Charlie, Tommy Ross and Charles
had meeting of Forward Movement
Committee. Mr. H. A. away - the
other member. Cleared up a lot.

April 22nd Raining & warm. Went down town in
Thursday. In morning to get some lace to mend
Dorothy's night gown. Did some mending
for her when I came home. Did the
entries and some letters for Charles.
Went down town with Dorothy to do
some last odds & ends of shopping.
Closed her trunk & helped Mrs. Ryan
carry it down to the veranda. Went to

Thunder storm at night quite heavy.

April 23rd Did the entries. Cleaned out Dorothy's

April 24th Did the entries & practised 2 hours.
Saturday: Still cold. Went down town in the

a quarter to eight and finished up
that part of the work. Miss Pearce had
her sister was ill and goes home
to night.

April 25th Still cool. Went to church twice and Sunday School. In the - went to their own church but came over afterwards and stayed. We left her here where we went to Sunday School and she went to call on Mrs. Bicker and home before we got back. After church Mr. Tuer, Charlie, Mr. A. & Alice came up. Alice had to go home because the babe would not go to sleep. The others held a Forward Movement Committee. I made them tea.

April 26th Did the entries. Charles did not Monday. Telephone for me in the morning as no one in the office. Wrote to Dorothy, Clara, Alma & Edgar Dark. Went to the office for the afternoon. Charles, Charlie, Mr. Davey and Mr. Tuer started on a fishing trip to Golden Valley. Are to spend the night at Leyleyland; go to Golden Valley in the morning and get back to town night. Mr. Lewan the H. S. Inspector was here to-day. He was a university friend of Charles' and called at the office to see

him. Very sorry he came when Charles
going away so we could not have him
at the house. Practiced on him in
the evening. Still cold.

April 27th Went to the office to help Mr. Caldwell.

Tuesday. Worked until 10' clock. Mrs. Pearce
came home so I did not go back until
about 3.30 p.m. when I finished up. Went
to Mrs. Milne's to see about getting dry
suit-fried. Mrs. Ryan and Mrs. Green
cleaned dry room, spare room, Dr. May's
room and upstairs hall to-day. In
the evening called with Mrs. Brattie
at Oliver's, Liebeck's and Mrs. (Rev.)
Scott to get members for Horticultural
Society. Rained in the night and
several showers during the day - some-
what warmer. Charlie had a letter from
Frank Dwyer he was not any better
and could hardly keep going but charged
him not to tell brother or anyone.

Wrote to Miss Small. Charles telephoned
from Waukon at 11 p.m. to say they were

get home until morning. Telephoned also.

April 28th - Cold and showery. Charles did not get Wednesday home last night - but arrived on the early train. The engine is still misbehaving and Charlie, Mr. Davey and Duncan stayed in Hamilton. Mr. Green came home with Charles. Mrs. Green & Mrs. Ryan housecleaning again - Mr. Delcourt cleaned and renewed shower-pipes in nursery - did away with the old drum which has lasted us for so many years. Very nasty day - wind and cold rain. Practised an hour. Went down town with S. S. Collection and deposited Mrs. Ryan's money in Bank of Hamilton. 4.1 - back as far as Davey's house when remembered that I had to bring home some soup. So went back to Charlie's for it. Charles prosecuting R. T. Harper for theft of turkeys - Messrs Robertson & Short - for defendant. All country interested and about 600 persons present at trial.

Went to Mrs. Clegg for my lesson. After tea cleaned the books in the library and wrote a long letter for Charles. Rain turned to snow - very cold.

April 30th Did some work for Charles. Went down for Friday meat and Charles gave me some more.

work at the office. Called at Mrs. M. A. Halliday's on the way home to give her Home Helpers' money. Went to work to class. In the afternoon - called to see Mrs. Treurniet's baby and also called at Mrs. Davis'. Regular folks saw Street Gang at Treurniet's as Mrs. Rogers, Mrs. Cruickshank, Mrs. Thomson and Mrs. Ewart - called while I was there. Went on down town. Mrs. M. A. - called after dinner to see Charles about banquet for May 10th. (Forward Movement) Mother - called while I was out - and Jessie Leslie and another girl called to see if I had any Leellen dancing slippers. (Sorry had none.) Practised about 20 minutes. After tea - went up to see mother. Found Mrs. John Dobe there. Duncan came back with me to look at 'Life'. Work to Well. Charles at Forward Movement Committee meeting. Still quite cool.

May 1st - Still very cool. Went down for meat. Did Saturday some work for Charles. Duncan came up to repair the tennis marker. Had to

Hunt up materials etc. for him. When Charles came home at noon he gave me another letter. Went down town in the afternoon and went into library to finish what card I could. Brought the rest home with me and got them all sorted into classes. Duncan was up in the evening and Mrs. Beattie called back Charles and I to judge of entries sent in by school children for the Horticultural Society. Did my needlework and darning after dinner.

May 2nd Did a whale for church. Went to church Sunday twice & to S. S. Got up at 7 a.m. as Charles and Mr. Halliday started for Inverho at 9 a.m. Mr. H. Blake service. Went to Bands Concert to hear one.

It seems a pity. Rec'd 4 pairs shoes

May 6th - Beautiful spring day. Did Re-enlist
Sunday. And a couple of letters. Went down
town for meat and called at Bank
of Hamilton to get information for class.
Took some cans & stored over to
Hospice for aldyⁿ. Mrs. Barrett there.
Stayed and gossiped awhile. Received
Shoes received from Natural Thread as
such low.

When I was over at Harper's Tombs
rang me up on the phone but I
never found out who wanted me
although I surmised it was Dr. Nickle.
Wrote to Clare and Mrs. Drayton. Went
down to see rehearsal of Miss
Mense's traps in "Business is Business".
Went on down to office with Mrs.

May 9th - Beautiful warm spring day. Went

Practised about half an hour.

May 9th Got up about a quarter to seven.

at their table. Came home and got
my tea and went back and
waited on the table. The school room
and tables looked very nice. Banquet
a success only not as many there as
were expected. Mr. Armstrong gave a

very fine address. He came back from China with Sweet-Dickson and highly
very highly of her. At the close of the
banquet Mr. Mrs. Oswald and Mr.
J.-C. Milne announced their intention
of giving \$500 each. Called visitors
on the way home to deliver part of their
goods we carried up.

May 11th - Went down town for meat and to
Tuesday get my & 4th stretched. Went up
to school room with Charlie to take

May 13th Went down town for meat. Called at Thursday. Mrs. Green's to pay her for housecleaning and at Mrs. Beattie's. Off-work. Typed 25 Forward Movement letters for Charles who went out to Peter-McDermid's with Mr. Halliday & Cawman for Forward Movement. Went to Clare and Frank. Practiced 1/2 an hour. Very cool at night. Had to wear Dorothy's fur when I went down at 9 p.m. to post my letters and could feel the cold through my coat. G.T.-telephone message from Rockwood Nat - Mrs. Joliffe is dead. Charles went to Preparatory Service.

May 14th Did a second list for Forward Friday Movement-Canvassers. Went to office to

get-Rene-posted. Delivered Mr. A. Halliday's,
W. J. Ross', Charlie's, Mr. Newark's, Mr.
Dolphin's, Mr. Birnie's and then went
around to George's house with his.

Practiced on him. Went down town
in the afternoon. Called see Mrs.

Caldwell who goes to Walkerton Hospital
on Monday for an operation. (Is going
over Sunday morning.) After he had
written a couple of letters for Charles.

Mr. Tiddis called to leave his forward
movement-cards.

May 15th Charles went to Rockwood on the early
Sunday train to Mrs. Phillips' funeral. Did my
knitting. Went down town in the
afternoon and knit a few rows on
Miss H. Harper's sweater while I was
in the store. Duncan came up after
her and Charles got home in late
train. Monday. Charles met a lot of
old family friends in Rockwood. Heard
that his grandfather and grandmother were
now present at the organization of
the London Missionary Society. The girls
Sunday * At the factory until the first last night.

May 17th - Mrs. McGregor ill so she did not come Monday after saying she would be here which made Mrs. Ryan late with the washing. Went down town for meat in the morning. Clancy, Visher and Douglas Caldwell were here for dinner as their father was in Wallerstein for Mrs. Caldwell's operation. Real spring day but looks like rain. Mr. Hubbard came up this morning and put the new tanks in the attic. Printed up some clippings for Mrs. Moore. Went down town in the afternoon after tea Mr. Abbott Oswald and Mr. Wm. English called for forward movement card. Went to Young People's meeting to see the Mission Band's little play.

May 18th - Charles and Mr. Andrew Young went Tuesday off at 9 a.m. to canvass their district. I went down town with my S. S. collecting in the morning and took my hat to Miss Jones. May 18th -

Sunday * Went to church and to Sunday School
but did not go to church at night - as
a representative of Sailors' Mission
took the service. Beautiful day. Walked
up and down outside for some time
after church in the morning. Communion
Sunday. Charlie, Alice and Duncan
were up after church at night.

May 19th Typed a letter for Charles. Went to

and Sophia Albright (for Clare to see
if she would go to camp). Charles went

letter for Charles after dinner. He was
collecting twigs cut off apple trees
by pruners. Went to post office at
Post Office. Then called to see Miss

annie Milne who appears to be very ill. Also called to see Mrs. Douglas who has been ill, but found her and Myrtle housecleaning. Charles had tea out-at Allan Kirkwood. Not very well pleased with the result of their canvass. Practiced an hour.

May 21st - Wrote a letter for Charles. Went down Friday for meat. Wrote to Frank. Ripped my autograph gown and dry red dress. Went over to Miss Milne's with the New York Junes. Went down town. In the evening Mr. Caldwell came up for some seeds. Then Mr. Kellerman came over as he and Charles are the committee for floats in the 3rd of June. Charlie, Alice, Duncan and Bill came up to see the - new tent and among other which arrived to-day for camp. It was after 11 when Mr. Kellerman left.

May 22nd Went down town to see about getting my Saturday suit fitted properly. Then went to see Mrs. Beattie about float for Horticultural Society. She gave me a check not strict

I planted. Wrote a letter to High school Inspector - with list of applicants for Principal Jr Charles. Called at Mrs Milne's with some flowers for Mrs Annie Milne who is very poorly. Planted some flower seeds. Went down town in the afternoon. Called at the office and took a long letter for Charles which I typed. Charles and I went down town in the evening to get the Han History from the office. called in Charlie's store.

May 23rd Fine day. in the morning. Went to Sunday Church home and to S. S. Rained in the afternoon. Mr & Mrs. Dyer came up after S. S. to see the tulips. After church at night Mrs. Beattie and I went for a walk. Then she came in and I divided up my seeds with her. Charlie, Duncan, Margaret and Alice went to Elizabethtown this morning for the 24th. Duncan & Charlie to paint the cottage - Alice & Margaret to clean it.

May 24th Got up at 5.30 a.m. Left at 7 for Brudenell. Monday Party - Mr. W. J. Ross, Charles, myself and

Mr. Beattie driving. When we got to Wallerburg
went to the green horse and ordered
Guaranuccino, Salvia etc - and got some
roses for Mrs. Caldwell. Then went up to
the hospital to see Mrs. Caldwell. Took
her the roses and a book. Found her
quite bright and cheerful. Passed through
Tomosa, Bellmore, Jamestown and
about a half a mile from Wyocton. When
we got to Brussels Mr. Ross insisted
that we go to his father's. Mrs Anna Ross
very ill. Mrs Smith (Sister) in charge of

Charles at session meeting.

Wednesday My knee was slightly sore last night - May 26th but when I was down town this morning it got much worse and I called to Dr. Rannie bandaged it for me but it got worse on the way home. However I went down town in the afternoon. Charlie, Duncan & Alice came up in the

evening and the new tent - was put up to see how it looked. A few holes & several patches discovered. Mrs. Beattie came over with some seeds and the Horticultural float - was discussed. Mrs. Curr in Toronto so no lesson.

May 27th.

Thursday. Knee quite sore. Mr. Dyer came up to see the tent - and I went around the garden with him to get artichokes, sorrel & onions. Went to bank with S.S. Collection and Mr. Ryan's and Tommy's deposits. Helped Charles take the tent down. Wrote to Clara. Just heard from aunt Maggie that Dora committed suicide & Charlie phoned that Mr. Engel died this morning at 5 o'clock, at 6.30 p.m. Charlie and Alice came along in the car and we left for Hanover. Called first at Engel's. Saw Jack, Mrs. Dwyers, Dr. Engel, Mrs. Engel, Duncan and Mrs. Ball. Mrs. Engel seemed quite dazed. Mr. Engel had been ill for 9 weeks with rheumatism. Then had pleurisy and finally the fluid on the lungs filled the heart. Dorothy got home on
