Gordon came from Hamilton Head Potatoes Buckwheat flour 2 Canoes of Indians 3 El Fishers slept in the tent and when they went off stole some Boats in the Bush 3rd Drawing Stones to the Wharf 4th Fine hot ^{calmed to day} ^{low Sunday} got 1 of 124 ft a part out of the ice. There are 4 of them froze in the ice all winter Gordon took his Boat from the head of the Island down to the door 5th in the Bush some rain some snow Hando made a cache of his own about 9 lbs a good lot of ice going down. A Big Jam struck on the head of the Island 6th of Fine Day The Steam Sparrows first starting out to day Mr. Williamson putting out Handed 3 Indians came to night Doy and Arthur fixed the Canoe put it out to Bismarck and I went to the Sturgeon stand shot at a White Owl did not get him too far off ^{7th} Liveria not well Blowing hard Indians here can't fish cold rain piling firewood at the door. Made an axe handle 8th Indians went off Gordon sugarin in the Bush piling Wood at the door a Big cache of ice at the door went off Wind high West 9th Blowing hard I went up around the stand found a Canada Cent at the Head of the Island set fire to some of the wood North side of the Island Gordon and Hando sugarin in the Bush A brother watching the Crows from going to the Sugar Bush never seen to day those Planets is in conjunction with the Moon and other Planets and seen that make a change in the weather 10th Boiling in the Bush drawing logs to the Bank drawing big stones from the east end of the house Wind haled to night.
