- 1 Wednesday. Fine bright day, not too warm
To 4 loaves 20
- 2 Fine day. Thomas and Alick Salway came
with the saw mill. and began to work after
dinner, they are to put at MacGillivray's. The
horses here, 4.00 per day. we to furnish help
Alick McDonald all day 1.25, he was raking
up the lawn in forenoon, sawing all afternoon
Mrs St Thomas paid \$4.00 for rent
- 3 One year today Papa died. This is a more
backward spring than last year
The sawers finished this morning about 8.00
Jimie paid them \$3.00. Gave Alick Macdonald 3
50.00 cash and credit for 1.37 1/2. Did not pay for
the two days meals at MacGillivray's yet
Mr & Mrs Brown called in evening
- 4 Has raining all night, and raining, yet 10.00 AM
Evening rained all day, now turned cold, have
a fire in the furnace all day, To 4 loaves 20
- 5 Fine bright morning, cold, gray frost last night
some snow fell yesterday, sent 1.00 to church
for the furnace in China, 25.00 for Sunday off
Mary Macpherson & May Macdonell was in for a
while last night. I sent to the Toronto News
26.00 for a Book Catalogue for Friday
- 6 Fine day, looks like rain. To butter 90.00
Mrs Ellis paid 1.00 for rent Paid Jimie the 3 dollars
- 7 Jimie went to Cornwall to see Far on some business
Murdy left for North Alick M D, splitting wood
had him yesterday at farm fence 1.25 per day
paid him 90 cash
- 8 Fine day To 4 loaves 20, rooled wheat 25
Marion left at 4 P.M for Lancaster with Daisy
to go to Montreal tomorrow I made about 1
lb butter

- 9 Fine warm day, most like summer of any day
this year, Jimie left for Montreal this morning
Murdy not home yet Ladies sewing at the vestry
- 10 Fine but cold west wind, Jimie got home
at 6.30 P.M
- 11 Fine cold. Far came before we had break
fast, he drove down, Murdy came at noon
I got a success from Laurence Stof Jimie 1.00
- 12 Fine day, a pretty large congregation
Sunday off 15.00 J.P. and Birdie were down 15
It turned ugly in evening wind and rain
- 13 Marion came at 10 last night, Ellen 1/2 day 25
To 4 loaves 20, Murday 1/2 lbs bacon 18.00 per lb
on Saturday
- 14 Had no chickens from Mrs Francis eggs, got
one dozen from Pullimer 16.00 and set a hen
in the trough in the shed at the barn
Murdy went with at noon I gave Jimie 1.00
on Saturday, to help pay MacGillivray for
the sawyers board
The Queen of Spain had a son on the 10th
Jimie had A McDonald 1/2 day working at
the farm fence
- 15 Fine warm day, Mercury up to 86, a very great
change since yesterday, Jimie had Jimie Smith
working at putting in posts for a wire fence on
the front of the farm, he dug some in the garden
in afternoon, they took out the trunk of
the apple tree that fell last year, Jimie
got 12.00 from Uncle Sandy, for the sugar and
sugar 5.50 was for me, I gave 50 to Jimie to
finish paying the wood Sawyer board - 1.50
- 16 Rain last night, and rain today, Now 10.00 AM
8 P.M. Cleared up by noon, Jimie Smith
1/2 day in garden and fixing the fence
on the farm Wilmet was down putting up
