3rd North East Wind Cold frosty snowing
Allen B Day Allen not well put the Bottom of the Marsh
hay stack in the Barn the West one
of the 3 stacks raised the stick at
the River as the water is raising hard
frost to night but the wind is too high
for the ice to take stop till 4
o'clock as Livena is not well just
the oars on top of the fence as they were
laying on the ground 4th Cold North
West wind high freezing hard Randolph
I set a mink's track in the cord Wood Bay
fishing the sledsleigh wind too high for
the ice to take a good deal of anchor ice going
down frosty to night But warm hours
East wind cold some ice took the storm
and poor ice as the wind was too high
before it fell it was then it commenced
to take drawing wood went to the head
of the Island just like glass took a crop in
some places 6th snowing & wind drawing
cold West Wind drawing wood
on the marsh hay stack eastone got a rat
