buried in Canal cemetery I drove up
as far as No 2 school Dick Carter with me.

evening. We thinned turnips par
greened potatoes and took in 4 loads

town in P.M. got at Steels shirting \$1.50 less
goods \$1.12 at Armstrongs 25 lbs wheel jeans dress 15
