1859

- 1 saved at croshes place & F. Moore went home
gave him twenty dollars as part pay for Mallet
head stone it is thirty dollars
- 2 drew in the hay from croshes & that fines
led our paying it is a poor crop
- 3 fixed the thrashing machine put in ^{some} new ~~then~~
threads heavy rain most of the day
- 4 thrashed & cleaned 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of fall
wheat very good
- 5 went to Lynn with the wheat to the mill
- 6 W^m Henry had it raised of at Barn stopt
to it when I was coming home
- 7 the Revd W^r Henry preached in our School
house in the forenoon he slept here all
- 8 night fine day
- 9 made the front Barn doors John
Armstrong made the hinges for them
- 10 worked at the stable & Barn the boys
worked at the turnips
- 11 grandpa & me went to Mallory town he went
to McCabe & Vandusen's to get buds & left
- 12 & L Thompson account to be sued
- 13 thrashed part of the fall wheat in the
forenoon & went to the Funeral of Jane Purvis
- daughter of George Purvis she was buried at
- the Stone Church the Revd W^r Hills preach
the church would not hold half of the peo
ple
- 14 thrashed the Blue stem fall wheat had 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel
- 15 I had 38 $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel in all saved 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel little
- 16 thrashed a little Rye but it was so hot & dry & the
horses sweat so much that we quit
- 17 went to the Quarterly meeting at Lynn grandpa went yesterday
there was a great many there very warm day
