- 3 Drove in the hay from Crestles & that finished our haying it is a poor crop
- 4 fixed the thrashing machine put in <sup>some</sup> new <sup>threads</sup> threads heavy rain most of the day
- 5 thrashed & cleaned 11 1/2 bushel of fall wheat very good
- 6 went to Lynn with the wheat to the Mill
- 7 W<sup>m</sup> Sloroy had it raised of at Barm stopt to it when I was coming home
- 8 the Revd W<sup>m</sup> Sloroy preached in our school house in the forenoon he stopt here all night fine day
- 9 made the proud Barn doors John Drinstrong made the hinges for them
- 10 worked at the stable & Barn the boys worked at the turnips
- 11 Granpa & me went to Mallory town he went to Jacob Vanduser to get buds & left I & Thompson account to be sued
- 12 thrashed part of the fall wheat in the forenoon & went to the funeral of Jane Purvis daughter of George Purvis she was buried at the Stone Church the Revd W<sup>m</sup> Mills preached the church would not hold half of the people
- 13 thrashed the Blue stem fall wheat had 12 1/2 bushel I had 3 1/2 bushel in all saved 5 1/2 bushel little
- 14 thrashed & little Rye but it was so hot a day & the horses sweat so much that we quite went to the Quarterly Meeting at Lyke Granpa went yesterday there was a great many there very warm day
