- 1 Sunday. There was a young student of Mr Gill preached today at Mr. Read H. Deut. Text Gal 4-7 was P.M. read John 3:1-8 D. in tonight
- 2 Visited two straw ticks. Got 1 gill maple syrup from uncle Dan Far went to the Gore. He sold marriage license to G. W. Fergusson Smith. to many Mary McEntyre. R.R. There was not many at singing class
- 3 Fine day, looks like good sugar weather. got a bottle of wash from the D.
- 4 Beautiful sugar weather at Mr. P. M. turned cloudy.
- 5 11:30 P.M. has been raining all day and is still raining Women's Meeting at G. Elders. 14 members present my offering was 25cts. S. Foulton & Lilly. B. we each collecting money for Point Tremble school. to help build a wing for the girls. I gave both L & S 10th each. Was at singing school gave Litch 6000 Lauder has not been to see us since he took the dishes away. Mrs D.D. gave me the 25^{cts} that I gave for Kennedy's
- 6 It has been a fine day Mrs Lauder brought about 2 1/2 gill. syrup. Far is out in Gore. I did but very little this week. My put and legs are sore. Mrs. Ellick Grant, sent did last night. I was in today gave a little sidine for her feet
- 7 Visited Lauder's syrup and it ^{did} not amount to 2 gill. Had a letter from Jimmie and a post office order for \$20.00
- 8 Had no sermon today Sanchy Cosin, read. and some others pringed. Far came from the Gore and had 1 gill of syrup. Handy cannot come to finish the singing. he has been ordered to Wales
- 9 Very fine day. In Cornwall with charge of the singing. Sent a letter to Jimmie. Uncle Donald had a letter from Scotland from his cousin Murdoch. Got 4 lb butter from Luntie
- 10 The anniversary of our marriage Very fine morning. about seven began to cloud and at 2:30. began to rain
- 11 Rained all day. sent a letter to Murdy 10 dollars

- 12 Cold E. wind all day. He got word of the death of Romy. Neil McFerman, he will be buried tomorrow
- 13 Fine day sugar weather
- 14 Sold 3 doz eggs. 17^{cts} per doz. got 4 lb raisins. 1 Chimus Luntie got a Telegram to meet uncle Sandy this evening
- 15 Uncle Sandy came last night and with him Annie McDonell. This is a lovely day. No Minister
- 16 Annie McD. went off to get the 5:30 P.M. train Sandy went later to get the 10:30 P.M. Far had a letter from Jimmie. He left last night for Montreal. There was a Mrs McDonald buried today in St. Mary's, who died suddenly at her daughter's (Mrs Corbelle). Sandy was to see Peggy
- 17 Another fine day. just enough to make this a good sugar day. He had a good temperance meeting near Calder McFelloray & Hewitt spoke. there was not many of the voters. principally women & boys
- 18 Rain today. showering. Was at prayer meeting. McFelloray was there. butched his legs cold 2 yrs. 150^{cts}
- 19 Jimmie came home this morning. came to the Gore last night. He was to Cornwall last night to hear Mrs Felt. Sidler. The vote to repeal the sect act took place today. and at 8:30 P.M. the repeal had 1500 majority
- 20 Over 2000. voted for repeal. And of the 9 Counties not one sustained the act. I was to see Auntie this evening. and I bought at Doris on account of oats sold in March 1. bottle of Electric oil 20 5 yds linnen 9-45. 2 towels 17-34. got from Annie 2 1/2 lb butter. got 3 success. the first of the season
- 21 Merion sold 2 doz eggs. at Jot's got 2 yds blue ribbon and 1 pint glass dish for Auntie
- 22 Fine day. Mr Hewett Methodist of Lancaster preached. Read 110. Psalm. & Hebrews 1:1-3. Text 6th verse of 2d chapt. Philippians. He and Richardson
