

July 27 Will & Arthur went to Welland

been washed it came out they went on the

Wed 28 Paul half day on the road got sick  
Will had 70 eggs in rakes on the hill Mrs Reeb  
came on the afternoon in try about the bees & at  
night they came after them on the afternoon  
another swarm came out & went on their hive  
Margorie & Hattie went to pick berries made 10  
instead of churning & washed out some things  
in change my underwear

Thur 29 hot. I churned & packed a crock of  
butter 11 1/2 lbs Margorie went up on the evening in  
George to examine to see if we could get seed potatoes  
I could hardly churn it was such a heavy  
churning

Friday 30 Margorie has gone over the river  
made down with Marggie, I turned my  
bed up & swept about the chest. Look the  
window out & washed it & put up a clean  
curtain & swept the dining room Marggie  
brought our groceries home. Had 3 doz eggs  
& 11 1/2 lbs butter @ 14. box 5" hatches 5" soap 10  
ginger 10 Tea 13 Peal 25 Soda 6' castor oil 10 Sugar 25  
oat meal 25 Lemons 19 Stamps 2. rum 50

Sat 1 Dominion day July 1905  
Dull all forenoon but so hot in the afternoon  
it started to rain & at times poured the  
poor little calves looked more dead than alive  
I got wet through getting the turkeys home  
rained on the night for all it was worth  
Arthur cut some hay Hattie stayed all night  
& churned

Sun 2 weather didn't look settled yet kept  
the turkeys on the barn until noon the new  
minister preached. Kate, Hattie & Tom had  
stern on the afternoon it got nice & everything  
so quiet. Hattie came over on the afternoon  
Margorie came home rode up with the brookshank  
Mon 3 dreadful hot - Paul went in pick  
strawberries made 78 lbs 1/2 for basket - I churning  
butter very soft Margorie working on Paul's  
shirt - I scrubbed where there was no carpet &  
cleaned the floor & scrubbed all the boards  
they drew in some hay

Tue 4. dreadful hot. I worked the butter  
then went at washing. I never felt the  
heat so bad Roy, Carl & Clarence came  
a terrible storm coming up wind blew  
hard for while it looked as if we were  
going to have a terrible bad storm one  
heavy clap struck some where close from  
at Cheppawa but it rained so hard
