the 10 Balls of yarn to get twisted a Frosty  
night 7 floating light no light to night  
27<sup>th</sup> Cherry Island no Light cutting Wood  
Fine Windy a Boat with 3 in it to same  
28<sup>th</sup> Sunday a Boat went Down at Day light the  
morning a Fine Day West Wind East Wind the  
Big White owl coming around Ducks Pond  
29<sup>th</sup> Drawing Wood 30<sup>th</sup> Tom Sack came for me to  
help him to skin a cow that died Cherry Island  
lit up St Andrews Day at Hamiltons to night  
1<sup>st</sup> of December Stormy Wind 2<sup>nd</sup> Fine Frosty cold  
to Williamstown with 8 1/2 Bushels of Corn Tom Sack  
came home Margaret Hamilton poorly a Steamer  
Boat went Down 4<sup>th</sup> I steam tug went  
5<sup>th</sup> Fine 5<sup>th</sup> Harming turned cold to night 6<sup>th</sup> St Michaels  
day Windy cold 7<sup>th</sup> cold Frosty 8<sup>th</sup> Ptolemy & Brother had  
found a stray on Chusters Island a heavy frosty night  
with a small Breakfast gave 50 cents Bought Kato

7<sup>th</sup> very Frosty came from Hamiltons expecting the  
washers at Hamiltons Jim McDowell made  
Track up the ice as he is going to take  
ashes to Fort Covington of Bull in Williamstown  
8<sup>th</sup> night Mrs Summers a Bull at Wood  
9<sup>th</sup> Drawing Wood 6<sup>th</sup> snowing & Wind Warm  
cutting Wood putting Marsh hay in the Barn  
10<sup>th</sup> Drawing Wood 8<sup>th</sup> High winds Print  
11<sup>th</sup> Day 18<sup>th</sup> cold 2<sup>nd</sup> Wind 10<sup>th</sup> snowing  
turned fine
