We had more than enough to plant the furrows & as rain came planted seeds all the afternoon. Some Mr. Johnson was in this morning to talk up Wild Mayo, Sir Adam Beck's from the bank, and wants to get all the good type names

for him they can as he says the saddle horse trade is becoming very brisk but the stock is hard to find. Col. M. Ewen was also in to look at Wilkins Douglas had told him about him. He thought he was a nice bull but too thin for what he wanted. Mary & I went down town to night but were pretty late for the bible class. I went to band practice and Mary went down to Aunty's where all of Harry's & Cecil were playing cards with Frank, who is being slowly won back to health. There was great excitement for a few minutes to night when the fire bell rang and ~~all~~ the town ran down to the lake where Hank Weener's cork house was on fire. The fire brigade got it out without much damage being done - Hank losing his corks. Cloudy but mild.

Dad and I went over to Jove's this morning and got another little jay of hay to load up for awhile. This afternoon Dad harrowed down the garden & started to plough the mangel patch. Enah worked over in the garden most of the day. I chard around, moved 15 little chickens down out of the loft, planted the seed
