Far & J. J. Brown left for Cornwall, % 5 lb steak butter Muddy by boiled Ham and cheese
Rained and stormed about 4. P. M. Mercury was up to 73 today
- 8 our visitors left Jinnie drove them to Apple Hill Mrs D. Fraser, daughter of Kenneth McLennan Duncegon came at noon and is going to stay all night. John Fraser is working today
- 9 Jinnie went to Lancaster and got a mowing machine. The man came with the Specks bot. 78, I borrowed % from Muddy Mrs Fraser left after breakfast
- 10 Thursday left early for north, Jinnie by 50^{cts} for sugar pan bread 24, got 2 qts cherries from Mrs J. Fraser pulled the currants, red, will boil them tomorrow

- 14 Gave 3⁰⁰ to Jinnie. Jinnie by 2 loaves 10 butter 47 bread 24 Muddy sugar at the sale 1⁰⁰ paid him 43 for butter got on Saturday
- 15 Fine day, J. Fraser at the hay
- 16 Finished the hay on the home farm I am preserving the 13 currants & Gooseberries Marion gave the second coat of paint to the kitchen floor yesterday Mrs P. MacLennan called, she was down to the sale
- 17 Rained all day, poured sometimes, Agnes Jamison of Valleyfield came in the evening. She came by boat to Lancaster, Jinnie met her (A McDonald paid \$400)
- 18 Agnes & Marion went to Lancaster to go on a boat excursion up through the Cornwall canal and down the south channel % 1 gall coal oil 13, 2 of soda 10
