Father took apples to cider  
mill. C & I laid up pit  
& covered it with straw  
& fenced it & plowed  
around it. We had a

We hauled corn in morning  
and covered one turnip pit  
in afternoon I loaned  
w<sup>c</sup> Morris the team  
and wagon to haul his  
hay. and he is to help  
us when we may need  
him

Friday 11<sup>th</sup> fair

Father went to mill with  
15 lbs 20 Oats & barley & chaff  
we ringed <sup>4</sup> the young bulls  
& killed Thompsons 98 for  
mutton & also bell w<sup>c</sup> as  
she was not doing well  
covered pit in afternoon Father  
went to cider mill.
