3 20 Chored. Pulled down & covered up Horse Power  
4 Doe went to Markham on his own Business A.M.  
5 Drew home wood out of old bush P.M. W. fine & mild  
6 21 I went to Markham A.M. sold Pine wood to A. Henry  
7 at \$2.00 Per Cord A.M. Helped Flavins Kill a Cow  
8 P.M. Doe drew home wood A.M. Took saw to Tom  
9 & Made wood rack P.M. W. very mild some rain P.M.  
10 22 I & Nancy went to Cedar Grove & <sup>slightly going fast</sup> hauled some  
11 Corn A.M. I brought home saw P.M. Doe drew  
12 home drags out of old bush W. like April <sup>slightly</sup>  
13 23 Went to Cliff & to M.N.'s for dinner Doe <sup>gone</sup> chopped in  
14 old bush. W. mild roads sloppy Bees humming. Corn  
15 flying. Things look like spring.  
16 24 Draw home drags A.M. Doe threshed & I  
17 Chored P.M. W. roaring wind from east & rain  
18 ~~begin~~ began to snow P.M. turned to rain this evening  
19 Christmas Day 25 I & Children went to Meeting  
20 at Hebron W. fine mild a little squally this  
21 26 at home all day W. heavy wind & <sup>morning</sup> snow  
22 from East A.M. turned to rain P.M.  
23 very heavy rain this evening a little lightning  
24 yesterday morning I forgot to mention it.  
25 27 Doe went to Markham on his own business  
26 A.M. we drew some about 12 drags P.M. W. mild  
27 28 drew home 15 drags A.M. Doe went to a bee  
28 Lawtons had in Dyke bush to cut pine wood  
29 for us I & little boys shot a Black squirrel P.M.  
30 29 Doe chopped in old bush I went to Cedar Grove  
31 A.M. did not do much P.M. don't feel well W.  
32 30 Doe chopped A.M. went to A.M. <sup>Cold east wind</sup> ~~concrete~~ we on his  
33 on account P.M. I & Nancy went to Whitvale P.M.  
34 roads getting muddy. April weather  
35 31 Cleaned Peas & little John & Doe sawed some at Maple  
36 tree in Old bush & I sorted turnips. They are rotting a little  
37 A.M. J.H. Rennie came at noon Doe to grist Chop  
38 to Cedar Grove Muddy P.M. W. like spring roads muddy

January 1, 1876 at home all day J.D.'s & B.C. were  
here C.B.'s came P.M. W. rain this morning drizzly & foggy  
2 Sunday 2. We all went to Meeting at Hebron, Adeline  
3 Staid with my Mother remarks & sermon on  
4 At Mat Part of 2 C by B.C. R.D. Hoover came late  
5 A.B.'s & Jindens boys & M.N.'s Elisabeth were here  
6 W. Mild Clear roads very muddy & bad  
7 3 I & Doe sawed some wood in old bush A.M.  
8 he split & I chored P.M. W. Clear blowed Cold P.M.  
9 4 Doe went to Duffins Creek & I went to Cedar  
10 Grove A.M. we began to cut sawlogs at Dyke P.M.  
11 W. froze hard last night fire Clear today  
12 which Barkholder & his wife Mathias from  
13 Indians were here last evening  
14 5 Cut logs A.M. Doe went to Jas. Milroy wood  
15 sawing Bee P.M. Sam Rennie & Emanuel Highwood  
16 from Maryland were here today W. pretty Cold  
17 A.M. Mild P.M. some rain this evening  
18 6 We went to B.C.'s on a visit Doe went to J. Hall's  
19 Chipping Bee. W. Cold N. West wind froze hard  
20 7 I & little John went to Markham to get a lot  
21 of Boots mended & got Nell & Frank school for  
22 feet W. Cold this morning Mild this evening  
23 8 I & boy picked turnips in Cellar <sup>Doe threshed Peas</sup> they are rotting pretty bad  
24 I think we picked out about 30 bus Doe threshed Peas  
25 W. Mild rained this evening after dark  
26 Sunday 9 at home girls & John & Flavins went to A.B.'s  
27 I got set new <sup>set</sup> single Harness at Dyke in Markham  
28 the other day. now they can draw out a little  
29 Dillers gangster & C.B.'s were here awhile today W.  
30 warm foggy dull & dismal as April rain heavy tonight  
31 10 I helped B.C.'s kill beef A.M. Doe finished picking  
32 turnips. he drew out another waggon load A.M. then  
33 he threshed Peas. W. Cold heavy blow from west  
34 11 Cut logs. W. pretty Cold. <sup>a very little snow</sup>  
35 12 I & Nancy went to Whitvale I took Crosscut saw  
36 & got it gummed Doe threshed four Peas & began cleaning them  
37 we cleaned & bagged up & load got B.C.'s waggon  
38 W. pretty Cold sharp north wind
