- 4. Rain all day % coal oil 15.00 ground cinnamon 10 25
- 5. Jimmie went to Cornwall on Thursday came home yesterday. % 35 butter 18. bread 20. Gas came to remain until after the Election 98
- 6. None from here in church but Murdy. I would not go it was so slippery. William Cameron 3rd Lancaster buried today in Lancaster
- 7. H. Cameron got in as Reeve. John Ferguson is out. A very large vote polled. I called at home. both Mr & Mrs. Doon sick. Lizzie Brown took dinner with Murdy and myself
- 8. Dull day, every one resting. No prayers yet this week. So many sick
- 9. The Factory closed today for a while. I do not know the reason
- 10. Very cold last night, turned to snow today. Settled with Jimmie, paid 10.00 for the beef, 80.00 for post cards, picture, He paid 10.00 to me of money borrowed in the summer, and 10.00 he got in Dec. to pay Gibbins for printing. % 3 loaves 15. rolled oats 25. rolled wheat 25. Stationery 10. We get the milk today. The factory will not take any for some time
- 11. Fine day. % Raymond for wandering a milk 25 13

- 12. Stormy, from east. Alick Macdonald paid 2.50. one months rent. % 7 loaves 35
- 13. Fine winter day, not many in church, Mr. Ginn was well enough to preach, Marion called for a change of underwear
- 14. Stormy all day, I made a small woolen wash. Mrs. H. Salway paid 1.00 cash 50.00 for papering. I sent an order to Froggiss for goods amounting to 5.00
- 15. Jimmie went to Martintown to the Sunday Convention. % handle for rad iron 15
- 16. Turned cold. There was an earthquake in Kingston Jamaica at 3.30 P.M. of Monday. Mostly all the houses within a radius of 10 miles were
- 17. % sugar 25. 3 packet of raisins 25. 8 lbs rice 25. 10.00 for fixing furnace pocket, Mercury said to be down to 26 last night in the village 75 10
- 18. Turned milder and is snowing. 2.30 P.M. Mrs. M. Thomas paid 4.00 for two months rent

- 20. Very high wind I did not go to church. Murdy in all day. Brown & wife called after Prayer Meeting. Sent 25.00 by Jimmie for expenses 25 25
- 21. Jimmie went to Apple Hill. a Hockey game there 25
- 22. Jimmie got home today. Buy cold. 4 loaves 20 20
- 23. John P. called. There was a fire at Jim Roy Grants old home yesterday morning. The tenants escape with only their night clothes. Jimmie by name
- 24. % 2 lbs lard 32. 4 lb. B. tea 20. Ginger 10. 1 lb. S. tea 25. On Monday, paid 20.00 to mail carrier for parcel 20
