## Diagnostic Hints in Senile Cases—No. 2.

The aged do not vomit readily. When vomiting occurs, it is due to some intense irritation of the gastric mucous membrane, either through drugs, improper food, or cancer. Reflex vomiting is rare. Diarrhea is almost always due to excessive food. Lientery is generally due to excessive food. If it persists, and consists of proteid food as muscle fiber, it is probably due to incomplete closure of the pylorus.—Nascher; Amer. Pract.
