Sugar as a Hand Cleanser.

D. H. Stewart says: "The most careful antiseptic toilet may be brought to naught by the preliminary use of soap; therefore clean your hands with granulated sugar and also dress wounds with it if you have nothing better." His experience since 1895 has shown that "with sugar and water, followed by chloride of lime and water, the physician's hands may be rendered sterile." This has been confirmed by laboratory tests. "Granulated sugar is gritty, takes the place of both soap and brush, does the work better, and leaves the skin unscratched, soft and smooth."—Med. Council.
