- 2 began to pull the Turnips a great many of them rotten just above the ground
- 3 worked at the Turnips fine day  
James Hazelwood Wife died of Consump<sup>tion</sup>  
the Revd Mr Benning Preached in canton
- 4 I went to Hazelwood wife wake  
5 went to the funeral of J Hazelwood wife at the Stone Church the Revd Mr Benning preached the funeral sermon there was 52 or 54 Baggys & waggon & some horse
- 6 went to Charlottown with 24 pork barrels
- 7 Jack & I went to Cristie's young this after noon on our way to Yananocque with <sup>men</sup> ~~with~~
- 8 went to Yananocque & Bought a Duram hiffin one year old from Dr Peckham paid him 30 dollars 40 was the price of her but he gave him 4 dollars as at back penny come to Ben Yonger and stop all night
- 9 came home to Day from Yananocque
- 10 went to Day to an Agriculture meeting received 2 50 & 50. Jack received 4 8 as premiums for the year Father went to the quarterly meeting
- 11 no meeting here to Day
- 12 drew dung to the field below the little orchard fine weather
- 13 finished drawing all the dung from the <sup>old Barn</sup>
- 14 Jack began to plow in the field below the old Barn the boys & me drew in 4 loads of potatoes from the Cristie's place
- 15 Jack plowed I went to a dung heap of J & Mc Inloch the boys finished drawing the potatoes 1 Good crop
