The following are the dates of the opening and closing of the seasons under the game laws:—  
 Deer opens 15th September, closes 16th December  
 —partridge opens 1st October, closes 1st February—  
 woodcock opens 1st August, closes 1st January—  
 snipe opens 15th August, closes 1st May—  
 hares and rabbits opens 1st September, closes 1st March—  
 ducks, black, wood, grey, and teal, opens 1st September, closes 1st January—  
 all other kinds of ducks opens 1st September, closes 1st May.
