April 17<sup>th</sup> 1892.

Easter Sunday, bright and clear  
but cold, wind was North West in  
the morning, turning South west  
about noon, and calming down  
at night, Froze very hard last  
night, I spent the day walking  
around till I am almost tired  
out, and saw very little after all,  
I made acquaintance with <sup>some</sup> of the  
boys, It has been a long and lonely  
day to me, To-night I am at  
work writing up an account  
of the past three days <sup>15<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup></sup>  
Lovely bright morning. <sup>15<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup></sup>  
wind, east till noon, shifting  
west. in after noon. quite cold  
this evening. and cloudy, Froze  
quite hard last night. Wrote  
to John Robinson Syracuse N.Y.  
and Gusta. Cameron East  
Very tired to night,
