 at 2. P. M. Very fine day. Got a book from Vancouver  
 from Marion (The First Hundred Thousand) by Ian, Hay

Mon 1 Fine in morning, turned to rain in afternoon

 Mon 15 Lovely day. Dan Christie here to dinner

 Tues 16 coal oil 25. Mrs Stewart paid \$9.00 for  
 3 months rent, Mrs Barrett called, Lizzie  
 from Gore brought me a gall maple syrup  
 Jimmie bot 2 gall syrup from Joe Major  
 1.50 pr gall = 3<sup>00</sup>
