

May 1891
Alf Sprague began Cook house foundation wall stump diggers began work today I went to see Bishop
27 B helped dig turnip Cellar A & I & J & A had a hunt after Cows this morning I could not find them last night we have had them on the roads this while. I & J tied stakes with wire between pasture & Meadow A M planted potatoes for Flannery & B & J took local sherting to D Rains & brought home great flour W. a little frost last night fine today turned Cows to pasture
Very dry weather grass grows slow
28 B helped at turnip Cellar A drew 6 loads dung from home to turnip ground at other place I went to Cedar Grove P M W. a little warmer, fine & clear
29 Boys worked at turnip Cellar I & A drew dung on strip that we left in field behind Cedar house for feed Corn plowed it down & sowed it with Corn A M then they spread dung & plowed the last of Flannery's turnip ground P M W. fine clear & warm

May & June 1891
30 Boys nearly finished turning Cellar I & J took Pens & Lats Chop the I M & piled some lumber A M I went to bring home Cattle I & Jarry went to Markham P M W. dry & warm
Sunday 31 all went to Meeting at Hebron remarks & sermon on by B. C. Ostron was here all day B took her home this evening W. fine warm
June 1 Boys tended Sprague with stones at turning Cellar & H brought 16 Bbs lime from Markham P M B & A washed Sheep B M W rain shower went around P M few drops any warm & sunny
2 Boys tended Mason & dug at last corner of Cellar I & A planted last of feed Corn in root field A M we drew home a ton of hay that we bought off B. C. Thomas @ \$7.00 per clover. I went to Cedar Grove P M W. fine shower of rain & some thunder early this morning. Cool & Cloudy today
3 H & B drew 2 loads sand A M I & J & B built an arch in Smokehouse
