

DECEMBER WEDNESDAY 13

Weather Soft

1876

Go to Furnace, find one of
Coal train for me, a large
load, Geo. Cummings, Hughs
& myself ^{a prospector} busy at Boiler &
Furnace all day till 5 P.M.
Get steam up, Sam Conklin
calls at my house at 5 &
tells me Hughs must go to
St. C tomorrow, to give evidence
in Re Innomellan.
New Currier sent by J.P.K. comes
today from Brooklyn.

DECEMBER

THURSDAY 14

1876

Go to Furnace at 7 stay all day
meet Hughs on road to St. C.
Two new Curriers come from
Ferguson, J.P.K. send them
Ship 6 Racks 68th to Chasch
and Morier to St. C. Prospector
goes on to watch, I tell him
the heat to keep up, Hughs
does not come home from
St. C tonight, Rack with 25¢
falls in Dry Room this week -
900 steam on, Pay Giddes 7.50
Cheque of J.P.K. this day for Freight.

Amelia Mass calls tonight, I see Currier
& deal at 3.00 as I go home this
evening
