Reposition of Prolapsed Herniæ in Children.

The child is placed in moderate Trendelenburg posture, and firmly held by an assistant. The surgeon blows in the face of the infant sharply and repeatedly, causing it to take shallow, jerky breaths. In this process the ring is relaxed, intraabdominal pressure is released, and then it becomes easily possible to reduce the prolapsed gut, etc., into the abdomen. An adhesive plaster dressing with pressure retains the hernia within the abdominal cavity.—Nusbaum; Münch. Med. Woch.
