 Far came today from Cornwall, had
 horse from Livery, Jimmie went up with
 him about 3.30 P.M.
- 12 Dull cold day, Muddy went to Lancaster
 to dentist, 7/8 yds B. cotton 45, flour oil cloth 49 97
- 13 Muddy went North 7/8 lb tea starch 10, L Chummy 17
 3/4 yd. Blue 23, 7/8 qt molasses 15, " lemons 10 58
 7/8 sugar for C. M. Intype 25, Jimmie got home
 at dusk got 8.00.00 from O.B. for Pa
- 14 Fine day, Jimmie ran the plough thro
 up the potatoes, had two little boys
 of Europe gave them 25cts, 5^{cts} for bring
 ing the cows, Jimmie left in after
 noon for Fishers, got 30 from Pa
 Mrs. Clark spent the afternoon and
 evening with us, went after night
 to the photographer but he was
 shut up, called to see Mrs. D. Miller
 7/8 yds brush trimmings 16^{cts}
- 15 Fine day, not many in church, Birdie and
 her mare here to dinner, I got my pictures out
 #3.50 The day I sat I paid 100, today 2.50
 got a roast 8 lbs - 64^{cts} 64
- 16 Dull day, Mrs. Montroy p. day, washing outside
 of windows, and outside windows 25
- 17 Began to rain at 11.0. M., rained until after
 midnight, Muddy went to Alexandria to meet
 ing of Conservatives, to nominate a candidate
 for ~~Domestic~~ Election, D. R. M. A. was chosen
 7/8 bread 20^{cts}, sugar 25, coal oil 23 68
- 18 David Grant's (elder) wife was buried at 4 P.M.
 at our cemetery, not a large funeral 12

- 19 Dull day, about 1 inch of snow fell, Muddy at
 Green Valley, Jimmie got home about 4.30, walked
 from Martintown, came by Apple Hill
- 20 Sold to Miller of Cornwall old looking range 1st old iron
 rags 20, made white washing, washed 1 blanket
- 21 Very fine day, to 5 loaves 25, working at a drop skirt
 for my silk dress
- 22 Muddy got home from Cornwall 9.30 P.M., took up
 some carrots put them in stable, put up the storm
 windows, on all the lower flat, lined clothes, done
 a little sewing, Mr & Mrs H. Brown came to Grassfield
- 23 Dull lowing day, at 8.00 P.M., rain last night
 Pransa here putting brick work around
 the furnace, to 5 loaves, paid for 6, got but
 2 will get 4 tomorrow, Mrs Brown called
 to ask Pa & me to tea tomorrow evening
- 24 7/8 lbs steak 50, 2 1/2 pork 30, Pransa finished
 the furnace, his two days, #3, Jimmie left for 3 -
 Cornwall at 6 P.M.
- 25 Fine day, I was not in church, morning or evening
- 26 Jimmie got home at 2.0. M. with a lively horse
 Pa went to Cornwall, and declined taking shares
 in the new paper mill, put felt boots 2.50 2.00
 1 pair kid gloves, 7/8 lb. B. tea 35 35
- 27 Cold and raw, Jimmie drew a load of wood from
 the farm, Thomas by two loads of turnips 90 bush
 Mary McIntyre spent a short time with us, she
 left J. Hamiltons, she is wanted at home
 7/8 bread 20cts
- 28 Fine day, Jimmie took up all the carrots
 and put them in the stable, I took
 up the dahlia's
- 29 Fine day, Jimmie went to Martintown
 to ploughing match, then to Cornwall
 home by train in evening, Hatty and
 baby called about 3.50 P.M., her John
