And I do not know much of what went on since I came to bed. William Mowat of the South Branch was buried on Monday. The sugar weather is in full blast. It has been a fine spring. Tomorrow is Good Friday. It is early this year. Very fine day. I made Easter buns and ginger bread.

I do not feel very well today. Steak charged. Easter Sunday. J. P. and wife were here to dinner. John Christie wife and John Robertson here to tea. They were down with Bill Ferguson's funeral. We lived with my niece Kelly Hoy. John Lavolette paid \$5.00 rent yesterday. Got 44 100 of flour on the 25th. 85c 1 lb butter on same.

28 Fine day.
29 Ann Hall 9c day washing 30c. Miss MacIntosh called, she looks very well. 7c butter 60c odd cents.

- 5 Very fine Mercury ^{at night} to 72. 7c 3 loaves 18c 19c. John P. was here and bought 1 gal syrup. Jimmie sent the 10 gallons of syrup to J. Brown Toronto and 10 lbs sugar 1.00. Rotted oats 25c 1.25
- 6 7c 4 lbs butter 1.20. Allen P. McDonald gave me 6 lbs sugar 1.20
- 7 7c 3 loaves 18c. sugar 25c. Paid Murdy 25c. for 1 lb butter 60
- 8 W & M. S. met at W. M. Thomson's. I was not there.
- 9 Snow last night and cold west wind. We had no fire in the furnace since Sunday until last night. Set a hen on eggs we got from Jerry Sullivan in exchange for some of our, which are not fertile.
- 10 7c 1 gull coal oil 20c. Rain today. Katie Christie brought me a plate of taffy on the 6th. due Bill. 20c 5
- 11 Fine but cold. 7c 3 loaves 18c. Sold 3 day eggs 18c for do.
- 12 Fine day. John and Birdie and Randolph were down. Sent 25c to church as off. gave 25c to Jim for off. 25
- 13 Good and bright.
- 14 7c 2 loaves 12c. Matches 5c. Ann Hall 30c. Mrs Doest paid 11.22c of interest. 47
- 15 Fine day. McDonald paid \$2.00.
- 16 Mousa paid 29c more for interest.
- 17 Mary Jane sent me blackberry bushes.
- 18 I planted the bushes by the south end of the
- 19 wood shed. 7c molasses 20c. Satorwa 20c. cash 42
- 20 Lard 20c. Brown starch 10c 30c. 2 loaves 12c 25
- 21 Sent 25c to church.
