Court held here the first time for
years. To 4 boxes by Murdy
- 4 Fine day. Went at night to call on
Brown. Helen came home. I am
doing very little but getting the meals
- 5 Fine bright day, cold. W. T. M. S. was
to have met at Mr Brown's, but Marga-
ret was not well, so they met at J. A. S.
I had no fee or offering 11 members & visitor
Had a letter from Uncle Randy
- 6 Stormy day. Fort Arthur was giving up by
the Russians. They could hold out no longer
ammunition gone, very little food most of the
men sick or wounded. The Garrison surrendered
on the New Year Day but did not leave un-
til the 3d
- 7 Stormed all night and now 11. a. m. Still
storming. Murdy left to take Billy D. McLeod
to Lancaster to get the train going west
This is the day for giving tokens for Communion
tomorrow. Mr Mc Kay from Nova Scotia
preached. He is to preach two Sundays at

- 8 Lancaster, 8th & 13th. I was not in church

of rain about 1 or 2 P. M.

for Foreign Missions \$1.00

- 10 I made two soxles washing
- 10 Fine day. Mrs Brown called, gave
me & Pa Xmas presents, one salt & pepper
shakers, him a white silk handkerch.
Miss Cotter & Mrs Stewart called
To 1 gall coal oil @ 1.10 Lamp chimney 25
- 11 Stormy. Jimie left at 4 P. M. for Corn-
wall to go to Ottawa tomorrow to see
Randy. J. P. M. Leman called
- 12 Very stormy day. Had a letter from Marion
and one from Randy who is in Ottawa
- 13 Stormy all day yesterday. Today, cloudy.
Bright day. Rooled out 25 25
Ed Demer paid \$8.50 yesterday for rent
up to 1st April
- 14 Turned a little cold & stormy. Pa went
to Cornwall. Murdy drove him to Lancaster
and went for him in evening. He
sent D. P. M. Leman cash of \$100.00
from him, went to the bank, and
got \$125.00. J. H. K. beat 7 to 2
- 15 Wild day, not many in church.
- 16 Cold day. Pullmore drew & made
