Fine cold and frosty East Wind Randolph Dan Spink and John He here 3 of them went to spear Eels got 8 George went off Sent Sonia ^{unfortunate} some things 2 Dollars cash a Belt a Jam O. Shariter Soap 2 Kinds of Fish Sweatmeats, an Indian with 1 Horse-Sleigh and 2 Dogs passed Down the south side Looking for Wood Bush is his name Spot followed them he stop at Lewis's coming Back Leander went over and got Sport he had no notion of coming home John He took 8 Eels with him. Fernandez crossed to Craig's to chop took 2 Axes with him Leander crossed tonight not so cold to night Windy to night 21st St Agnes Day Fine kind of Warm Wind. Drawing Fire-wood 3 Loads in forenoon Unfortunate Day Windy to night Froze hard Rained a Shower 22nd Fine Day St Vincent's Day The Shining to Day is an omen of evil and the Shines to Day most Beautiful Unfortunate Day Frosty to night LILLEN Victoria Departed Born the 24th of May 1819 aged about 8 years and 8 Months a very Good Lillen a Sops to the Empire George Smider died as they were taken him to the Hospital 23rd Fine cool Frosty Leander and Stanley on the Bush chopping & Wind Randolph here scated Down took my Kansas Paper Down The Kansas City Weekly Journal January the 17th Wrote a Letter to Dan concerning the Death of Carlo Dated inside The 24th Leander to Summerstown took the coal oil can Windy some cold 24th Fine St Paul's Day if Fair a Happy Day This is Charles Juppers Birth Day of the Butternut Island Fernandez came to night 25th Robt Burns Birth Day a very Fine Day Fernandez to Summerstown cutting some Wood 1 Horse sleigh of Indians went Down to Ross Island on the North side for Wood Drew 3 Loads to the Bank Logs to the

Fortunate Day a very Fine Day a few Flakes of Snow this Morning an Indian passed Down with a Team to Ross Island for Wood splitting Sogs at the Door First Time for Stanley to be Shaved Reuben and Jessie came Down on Skates From Cornwall 10 miles to 2 They Left Cornwall And got here 1/2 Past 3 pretty good for them not knowing the Road or the ice Leander crossed got the Mail Received the Gazette Almanack From Dan Bought Haggarty Tea and Sugar Fernandez came 27th Fine Randolph and D. Spink came had a Spear Dan made himself for Eels on the Mud went to spear Eels got 22 The 2 young Folks Reuben and Jessy started for Cornwall a Change in the Moon Snowed through the night 28th Snowing to Day Randolph came grinding axes had a Dog with him one of the cows calved yesterday 29th Fine cold Day chopping some calve to night Fernandez crossed to night came Back said the Rev Mr. Mathewson was coming tomorrow 30th Fine Day & Wind 2 Rigs of Indians went Down for Wood The Boys Leander and Fernandez went to Lancaster to get the Horses Shod 80 cents gave 25 cents for Rice 6lb 5lb of Tea 1 Dollar 10lb of Nails 50 cents Rings fixed The Revs Mr. Mathewson and Randolph here Read from the 6th chapter of The Galatians and then Quoted from that also a very Good Prayer Brought me the Christian Herald and in it very good Reading Boys came They say the Road goes Down on the ice From Dan Frasers to Lancaster Bushed drawing stones to the Wharf there Fernandez crossed to cut ice for So Douquett 31st Fine Fair and Frosty & Wind Stanley and Leander chopping
