Test for Empyema of the Frontal Sinus.

The patient is taken into a darkened room and a small electric torch held under the supraorbital margin, with its light directed upward. If the frontal sinus is normal, the frontal region just above the orbit is seen to be translucent; if there is empyema of the frontal sinus, no such translucency can be elicited. This is a convenient test for the general practitioner and will often clear up the nature of an obscure frontal headache.—*Sarbo; Med. Klin.*
