1 lb kind of cakes, by Jimmie, sowed carrots beans, peas & corn, in garden today Pa has Corrie fixing fence on old Game ground lot. Katy a mare colt I forgot the day
- 22. Fine cool day. The shower of yesterday did not lay the dust, in this vicinity
- 23. Got 2 lbs butter 50, yeast 5, on egg. bill Pam tree Pa
Murdy went to Cornwall, Pa. sent for 100 dollars
- 24. Fine day I was not in church. Bridie was not down
- 25. Fine day. nothing going on here, to celebrate the day not even a fire cracker. We have up the flag
- 26. No rain. Boys drew a load of hay. are putting in the posts for fence from creek to Jimmie's lane. 7/2 butter, at factory
- 27. Boys putting on the wire web I sold 2 doz eggs. 13 pr doz. 7/4 pt molasses 15. 1/2 lb 44 at tree. Pot Cheese 25- 60
- 28. Murdy went last night to Cornwall. Jimmie went today drove Katty. I baked some in the stove. Sent Bridie's things by Thomas gave him 1.00
- 29. Rev A Mathewson preached. 66 Palm. 14 was I made some calls. Murdy's, Rev Kenneth, Mr Crim John Lis. & Jerry Sullivans, his wife is very poorly
- 30. Doy cold day. A pretty large congregation. Bridie was here to dinner. Murdy was in Cornwall Got 100 from D. B. M. L. for Papa. D. M. Common paid 10.00 for last years ground rent of Russell house. 7/2 lbs steak, 2 lbs sausage
- 31. A large congregation. Aunt Mary & Mary

- 1. Monday. Fine dry day and no sign of rain. Sandy. Mr Intyre paid \$8.00 for ground rent of the lot he bought from Shuldo. Finished the fence along the side with R. wire cost 10.50 Paid Steponis from 1st prp. to 1st June 3.00 to P. W. R.
- 2. Another dry day, some warmer. 7/2 lb sausage 20. 1 lb steak 60. 1 pan bread 20. Jerry Sullivan began working on the sidewalk between the creek and graveyard. Had a call from Clara Kennedy. Done a small washing
- 3. Jimmie & Murdy went to Cornwall. There is a circus there. Marjory Brown was married to D. Orange today. 7/4 lbs butter from factory Mrs William Campbell was married in Cornwall on Monday to John Ambrose, Dunn
- 4. Fair all around. more than 1/2 doz houses burned in Colow yesterday. And Montclair Station was burned. W. F. M. I met at A. C. today, my offer 25.00 No rain yet or sign of it
- 5. Sold at Wallig 4 doz eggs 52. with 40 of old but. 92 7/4 apto short lining 63. 1 lb ramm 13. 2 shalight 10 80
peppermints 10. 7/2 lb tea 30. at J. A. 40
- 6. Mrs Montroy 1/2 day done a good deal of cleaning 25. 7/2 pan bread 20. of Demos 2 lb steak 1.5
- 7. Mr Langel preached in afternoon. text from 103 Pa
- 8. Murdy went to Dalduth. by train. Had a slight shower, not enough to wet the dust. Planted a few beans
- 9. Hot lobby Campbell had a bull calf today Planted beans on hill by burn
- 10. Factory report (2.48) 7/5 lbs butter. gave 1.68 to Jimmie He went to Alexandria. on route to Maxwell 7/2 pan bread 20
- 11. Murdy went to Cornwall. Truffer took our calf
