Anesthesia in Arterial Sclerosis.

In subjects having high blood pressure from atheroma or arterial sclerosis, chloroform, in the hands of one skilled in its use, should be the drug of choice, since its excitement is so much less marked. After the patient is once anesthetized ether drop may be tried, though often in these subjects it will not control them on account of slow absorption, which keeps the patient just at the stage between excitement and complete anesthesia, manifested by irregular and explosive breathing and struggling.—Dr. A.
