4<sup>th</sup> after the cable very unwell fixing the  
cedar Logs around the old house set fire to chips  
a great lot of Yarning now 5<sup>th</sup> very unwell  
put a Plaster on my Breast put the nails  
again on the cable digging in the Back garden  
about 5 hens Laying now the new Lighthouse

5<sup>th</sup> of an Order from Lewis Blondeau  
Peter Buchanan & a small man here  
Went all night St Peters Day 30<sup>th</sup>  
last Day of the month Fishing 1<sup>st</sup> of May  
DOMINION DAY Went to the Pit Pit  
played Gordon Randolph and threatening  
3<sup>rd</sup> flies on the Bushes there 2<sup>nd</sup> Salab  
a Pleasure Trip from Dundee 3<sup>rd</sup> Hughlin

of July Orangeman's Day Fired 2 shots that  
killed the Rowler I had Raining wind changing  
very often to Day 13<sup>th</sup> Following a Road around the  
Barn put in about 2 Cocks of hay Raining  
during heavy Lightning and Thunder May  
Bennis Ripe windy time then saying some noise  
Made a Road to the River Baited the line  
took home a Load of Wood from the back  
Marsh eat Cucumbers hurled my eye 15<sup>th</sup>  
Went to the R O got a letter from Chas on St  
Suthens Day No Rain 2 Likeness in the  
Bought of A Baker 1 lb Tea 1 lb plug Tobacco paper  
Matches treat got the rest of the Duck  
in cash He took up the night line got 2 Eels  
from Cashed Fishing Coked some hay  
the Oven put some in the Barn

ashes at 10<sup>th</sup> 5 Doz of eggs 20 lb of Rag at 1/2  
62 of old Iron Bought of Mr David Baker  
3 yds of 7 Lamed at 1/10 4 yds Cotton at 7/8 4 yds  
Dales at 17 cents 1/4 lb Tea 1/4 lb Powder  
5 lb Cut Tobacco 1/2 \$ for sweets Gordon got  
some sweets from Mr Baker Took  
dinner at Mr Donald Supper had a  
chat with Angus took down Mr  
Mavills flour and ice 20<sup>th</sup> Went down  
with George Bosell's canoe Back all  
on the Berries very warm 21<sup>st</sup> Moved down  
in the Grove 22<sup>nd</sup> Followed a Road in the bush  
south and West crossed to Summerston in the  
small canoe Bought of a Baker 1 Pair of  
1/3 Treat 1/6 Bid for a B gun  
at his going to night to
