Sunday Unfortunate Day Fine Day
George came on snowshoes had a pair
of mitts came in minutes from
his place Randolph here Stanley
Came home from Kershaws all
had a Jolification on Gordons food
Staff 3 of them went to night church
The cow laid out and skinned
17th Unfortunate Day Fine Fair
and frosty Began using this flour
Randolph here gave him the 2 papers
to put in the P.O. to Janagides and
Billy Stanley not here I don't know
where he went and if they know
they will not tell just some of the
wheat and flour upon the East End
snowed through the night another of the
white owls flying around cool fine
18th James H. Hign's Birth Day
1855 47 years old today Fine Day
nowing some Windy snowing drifting
an ugly day doing a little or nothing
snowing to night 19th Fine Fair frosty
snowing some at the door its a
drifting to day to Beat
Sun shining cut a lunch Board for
to make snowshoes made a pair to night
20th This is called the Steel Day till
the 28th Fine Drifting Sun shining Day
Boarding from the North West Window
Gordon and Leander at South Day Gordon
Went to the Salem Church social

James Cameron Island 21st Feb 1902
A Fortunate Day a very Fine Day the
sun is Warm Randolph here Brought
the mail a letter from John Cameron
Junction City Kansas Leander Boarding
the West side north up stairs Gordon
Came to night had 2 letters from
Maxwell and one from Mr
John McBean my old friend
and schoolmate He was
always a good churchman and
a good Christian and an excel
lent scholar and a good teacher
I am aweful about my sight
Those letters I got I cannot
read and the mistress has to
make them out the best she can
I am thinking my sight will get
better still I am doubtful
I will be glad to get the Book
as they will read it to me
and I used to be so used to
that Route from Martintown to
the Scotch River Mr Savens Mills
Riceville and other places we had
lots of friends out there the Cambells
in the 19th or 20th Malcom Campbell The Mac
Percher or Mr Herracher the Buffels
his Mother was a near Relation of ours
the Mr Bermuds and the Camerons
