

Wednesday September 23rd

I pulled corn here and piled it this morning while Dad & Frank put on a load over home and took it down. Frank came out here this afternoon and put on what I had pulled and helped me finish the field. We got down in there about five and didn't have to wait very long to get unloaded but it was dark when I got home. We just had 2380 m. The field didn't turn out nearly as well as I thought it would before we started. There is still a patch back of the farm but we will leave that for a day or two. The Baylys were over this afternoon to invite Mary's a party there on Friday. Mary's corn is today. Frost slight by last night, no damage.

Thursday September 24th

Mary & I spent about an hour this morning stretching a couple of pieces of short woven wire around the end of the orchard to prevent the cows from getting into the door yard and from there any where else in the country. We thought we had a cow proof fence but when I got home to night I found Mary out. The fence kept the other two in the orchard and Mary must have jumped it. I put her in the barn and then drove the other two around and I got here.

by the time I got them there Mary had disappeared. It was dark then and Mary wanted to have tea so I let her go and when I went out after tea I found the horse stable door which I must have left unbarred had blown open and Mary was in there with my good harness down and in an awful mess. I was mad enough to kill her. I went over home about ten o'clock and Frank and I pulled and piled corn till noon and loaded it and took it down this afternoon. We had quite a long wait to get unloaded so it was fairly late when I got home, but I met Roy Homans on the Winding Hill with a big load when I was coming home. I went to see Dad & Enah up to Coulbome today to see if Dad could get a certified copy of his marriage certificate. But their church records don't go back far enough. Dad didn't think it was vitally important as Mr. Parks has the original but it is not certified.

Friday September 25th

Went over home this morning and pulled corn. Dad & Frank took it down this afternoon. I drove down in the buggy and got some groceries and came straight home but it was five o'clock when I got here. Mr. Bayly came out and took Mary & the baby down to a
