Post-Operative Suggestions.

3. The dressing should be done as rapidly and with as little general disturbance of the patient as possible, and unless it is absolutely necessary, the patient's head and shoulders should not be raised much during the bandaging.

4. The bed should be warmed, great care being taken that no blistering of the patient's skin occurs from hot-water bags.

5 Pain should be stopped.

6. Absolute rest should be given. Talking, noise, questioning, or fussy, unnecessary disturbances about the bed or room should not be allowed.
