

June 1 The ground is to wet to cultivate for the potatoes put some of the ashes on around the trees in the orchard

2 washed the sheep & cleaned out the wood shed in the forenoon cultivated the potato & corn ground in the afternoon & worked some of it out

3 finished working the potato & corn ground & planted 14 1/2 bushel of potatoes 4 of the Early Rose the rest Chilies & Seedlings then we planted 1 1/2 bushel of western corn 2 ears of Nebraska Sweet Corn on the west end of the two rows next the fence then a little wheat that Ad brought from Manatoba, the rest of the rows our own Sweet Corn so as to compare it with the western

4 I am so bad with my eyes I can't do nothing ^{corn for feed about all} Ad went to J. Johnstons his son Fleming died last night he rolled & dragged part of the garden it was so hard ^{lumpy and} could do nothing

5 went to the funeral of Fleming Johnston he was buried at the Union Church the Rev. W. Cannon preached there was over 40 terms the church was full

6 Sheared the sheep & planted about a bushel of potatoes Early Rose in the garden that finished the Spring's work fine little ~~plants~~ in the forenoon Rev. W. Gordon came here last night James W. Miller took him to Fairfax this morning W. Cuningham preached this morning W. Gordon at night

began to work the trees with Sulfur

8 Ad went to Gouanogis with Pezer to school bought 100 oat meal Dined & we came here to day

9 Ad began to roll the crop he rolled in the North field he thinks that the worms is cutting some of

10 finished rolling the North field worm day

rain

11 plowed ~~plowed~~ scraped & leveled a ditch on each side of the road from the gate to the house rain in the afternoon it is doing a great good

little rain this morning

12 Ad went to the Sawmill here Darling, Dean, Young & Capland to see the lumber for the side walk at the station
13 Ad went to the River to fish I took 3 catfish to escort 4 bushel of peas & 1 of Sweet corn to the Mill then Rev. W. ^{Zerguson} preached this morning & W. Robinson at night
