

I put separates together & separated the milk by went  
to church, another beautiful day smoky like  
Indian summer at 3 o'clock the children took  
the cows out for awhile

Mon 23. the children guarded the cows in the forenoon  
& after school, I churned & worked the butter. blacked  
the stove cleaned most of the floor after I churned  
the turkey buyer here got 2 gobblers for \$3.25, Hannie  
came home from Sharp's rather nice day looked  
like rain. Paul started the post holes

Tue 24. Margorie came home from Clifton, Arthur  
ploughing. Paul boring post holes in the after-  
noon. I carried water to wash, went up to set

Wed 25. I washed & put the clothes to soak washed  
some of the colored clothes a most beautiful day  
wind a little cold Margorie went after her things  
at Chippawa. Paul went up after the fence posts in  
the forenoon. Hannie & the mother went to Drummondville

Thurs 26. Tom McCreedy helping Arthur ploughing  
Paul helping Fred he was detaching & hung the  
clothes out & washed a lot. more it rained for a  
while in the forenoon, but cleared up in afternoon  
awfully I had to bring them in before dark I churned  
& worked the butter

Friday 27. Paul went to Chippawa in the forenoon  
got the wire 3.74 for 115, took a reel of bales 3.00  
made at 3.10, told it to Kester for the money

about posts

after dinner, they made the fence & the children took  
the ropes from or stretchers from, I rined & Margorie  
baked bread, the wind high, I mended Paul's  
overalls.

Sat 28. beautiful day, Paul drawing rail with  
Frank & Topsy 4 loads, Margorie swept the front-  
room & kitchen. then went & swept the school house  
I got the honey out of the hive, took me most of  
the forenoon then got dinner & made 3 apple pies  
& white cookies & churned for ourselves

the children guarded the cows, quite cold wind  
Sun 29. Hannie & Marguerite went to the brick church  
not a bad day, rather too warm for comfort  
Will & Lill went to Kealey's

Mon 30. rained in the night, drizzling this  
morning the children took the cows down to the  
school house field when they went to school poured  
rain at dinner in the evening & the afternoon. I  
cleaned the pantry dishes & put paper on the shelves  
Margorie washed her bedroom windows & one front  
room window took children to school

Dec 1908

Tue 1. beautiful day in the forenoon towards night it  
got terrible cold at night in fact when school was out  
it was very cold, the wind was high & from the west, I went  
down & swept the school house & dusted. Arthur finished  
ploughing out here. Paul started the cellar drain Margorie  
washed Cordons & sweaters & fixed it for him to put on  
Wed 2. the cold terrible just like winter & keeps it up to long  
not paid Frank \$2.60 for flour he came after the barrel
