M. 13th. Haul of lbs. 32 lbs. Digging potatoes. A book from the library.

J. 14th. Digging potatoes; the Redneys 12 Bushels Received of Mrs R Hay Cen the sum of Two Dols for the cows to Btl. Robert received also one Dol for the pig Hayden had.

W. 15th. Smashed digging potatoes, Billing turnips.

Th. 16th. Billing turnips and hauling the same.

F. 17th. Billing and hauling turnips got up 120 Bushels.

S. 18th. Taking up and putting turnips 110 Bushels.
