sugar 75. paid 4 1/2 for 1 doz 3 eggs @ 22. - 28. ^{in cash of my money} 15 ^{land} 17 ^{land} 4
Sat 17. Marjorie baked bread. I ironed. & Marguerite
helped. I baked a ginger cake & two cherry pies
swept the kitchen & yard cleaned the boards Marjorie
swept the front room Marguerite dusted the swept the dining room
I cleaned it. Will & Lelly went to Chippawa on the morning
Sat 18. meeting here Paul got here on time for church they
all went from here & the other house the minister went to the
Reisinger for dinner Marguerite went to the brick road
both ways Hattie walked up & Fannie walked back the
boat over in the evening Paul stayed for supper Arthur
& Luc Reisinger went to Chippawa church
Sun 19. Marjorie Fannie & the youngsters went after
cherries again got 15 qts. the went on to the threeder
wheat works & 100 lbs. & 100 of flour at 12 with @ 3. 13
Will killed the blind hen & I got it ready for their
dinner she weighed 4 lb. I had in churn. they cut

the wheat in this field then went over on the hill
Fannie here in team we got our cherries all picked
that Reisinger here - on the afternoon awhile
Sun 20 Mrs Bugert & Mrs French here for dinner I made
a cherry pie I jelly bars for dinner Hattie worked them
for tea so I got the cherries canned 11 qts. & a pie. Ekel
& George Montague for tea. they cut the wheat down the
road. Fannie shocking up. the children walked to
Wallace to tell why we did not go after currants
Wed 21. sprinkled rain in the morning they cut their
wheat up on the back road. grocers Picnic for
I Ruth went after currants got 9 qts. 45 ct I churned
& cooked the meal I bought yesterday for 15. cooked
the last of our ham fat - I done up 4 qts of the currants
Thurs 22. done up the rest of the currants - 13 qts. lb for lb.
they cultivated their corn Marjorie working on
Beets white dress. I put a bed with raddish &
lettuce. rained off & on I poured tonight 4 lbs
chicks out of 13 eggs chicks killed 3 of them rest of
the eggs broke. a good thing the old turkey is on the farm
just before we went to bed poured
Friday 23 I churned in the forenoon after dinner I washed a blanket
& quilt & some other things terrible hot Lucy sick or that way
Marjorie working on her dress got at night the wind burned with
blew a small gale I poured rain the clothes whipped for all
they were worth - Arthur & his father he town got his new suit
Sat 24 I carried over a lot of fruit made a custard pie black
currant bars & white cookies swept the dining room I ironed Mary
swept the front room worked on her dress. Will killed a hen I cleaned
her. she baked bread yesterday & being rained tonight again
