- June 1 Went to help to make a road up the hill to where they are going to build the school house there was only B. Warren J. Gilbert J. Shields ^{worked} the Rev. Mr. Weir preached in the school house in the morning
- 2 Sheered the sheep in the afternoon John Corley & Cornet helped I hauled up the sheep & cleared out the stable in the morning fine ~~morning~~ day
- 3 plowed 2 ridges of the corn field below the barn & furrowed out 2 ridges of the potato ground the ground is hardly fit yet rain this afternoon
- 4 lot of a lot of water the ground is as wet as it has been yet it rained most of the night went to a raisin of Cornet's a fine warm day
- 5 went to John Ivies with 36 young & put in our sawlogs all but one that we could not get at
- 6 planted 8 bushel of potatoes Ellen, Isabella & Bessie helped furrowed out the rest of the ground
- 7 rained this forenoon went to a meeting of the Agriculture Society very little done ^{the} forenoon the Rev. Mr. Taplin preached in the forenoon & the Rev. Mr. Weir in the afternoon
- 8 helped Thomas Stennet at the Sellar ditch it was all filled at the outside wall paid him 1 dollar
- 9 went to John Young's this morning sloped all night they are all well
- 10 came to Robert Armstrong stoppled all night dug up a lot of Spruce & Cedar for to plant
- 11 came home Mary Beatty came home with me Sister Betsing is very sick got dinner there in
- 12 planted the Spruce & Cedar trees on edge of the ditch along the lane to the barn
- 13 drew 120 bushel of sand for Hugh McKeen the forenoon went to Ivies there is no lumber yet Ellen, Isabella & Bessie planted 9 bushel of potatoes the Rev. Mr. Weir preached this morning I could not go was laid with the bowel complaint fine day
