Cloudy day strong east wind raining and freezing trees all coated with ice. We did sundry indoor jobs to-day sorted some potatoes they are not keeping well.

Stormy snowing cloudy not very frosty. Roads very icy. We took down 10 bags to Scheris they weighed 1820 lbs @ 62¢ per unit \$112.80 averaging 20 cts
