Inability to Urinate.—Following certain operations, such as goiters, laparotomies with small incisions, etc., it is preferable to get the patient out on the side of the bed rather than to use a catheter. The use of the catheter should be limited as much as possible since infection of the bladder may occur in the best regulated hospitals.-Balfour: Mayo Clinic. Med. Record.

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
