24 Rain this morning. Far left in the rain for Cornwall
 To 8 loaves 36 I am fixing over my old silk skirt -
 There was a tenant came to live in the house where
 Ellis lived 2.50 per month 34

25 Fine day, but cold To butter 65. D. Mackeman
 of Martintown called to see us. Jimmie drew two loads
 of wood 65

26 Fine in morning Jimmie drew two loads of wood in fore
 noon. It rained in afternoon and evening.
 I saw a woman at H. Pigeons who seems to be living
 there. She has been going around since Monday

27 Rain Paid \$2.20 for wall paper for the house where Ellis lived 2 20

28 Jimmie went to Lancaster and took home a spring for
 a bed, and a music cabinet, that Far sent for to
 Eaton. To 8 loaves 36. Butter 65. Drizzling 1 01

29 Fine in Morning. Jimmie is not well. So only Marion
 from our house in church. I sent \$2.00 1.00 for the
 stipend ending March and 50.00 for Sunday offering 2

30 Fine spring day. I sold at Franklins 4 doz eggs 16 per doz
 Got rooled outs 25. Sugar 25. 1 gall coal oil 20. pepper
 into 5. Paid 11 in cash Mrs Pigeon sent her rent 18.3. 86
 by Agatha, Muddy went North

31 March is going out like a curly bear 7 12
3 60
5 47
16 19

1 Wednesday. Fine bright day, but cold west wind
 To butter over 4 lbs, 30c per lb \$1.30. 4 loaves 24 1 54

2 Far came about 5.30 P. M.
 Left in morning Far went by train Muddy drove
 him Lancaster I was at the W. F. M. meeting
 held at Rev Waddell's. My offering 25, for Leaflet 40
 I was at the concert last night. It was very
 good. And quite a large audience
 In afternoon it began to snow and at times
 it was a regular blizzard

3 It turned cold last night and was freezing
 all day in the shade. John P. Mackeman
 brought us a gall of new syrup yesterday
 I made a small washing, and washed
 some things to put on the snow To 8
 loaves 18. 3

4 Fine bright day but cold west wind. Jimmie was not
 out since last Saturday. Today he went to Lancaster
 for a desk that Far was getting from Eaton, and
 I went to MacIntyre and got 3 lbs of pork ham 36
 then to MacKimmens where I paid the ground rent
 on the globe lot \$4.00 (2.15 tax). a cable cutter Raymond 3

5 It was today that the envelope with \$2.00 was put
 into the Sunday collection instead of last Sabbath
 I was in church, it is a lovely day

6 Fine day. Far came in morning. Marion took
 down the curtains of my bedroom and of the hall
 Mrs Brown called

7 Very fine day. Got loaves 24. 2 lbs butter 30c per lb 84

8 Big snow storm, 9. A. M. terrific turned to rain

9 Bright day. Marion washed I am cleaning the
 kitchen stove. Jimmie got 10 gall maple syrup
 and 20 lbs of sugar from Mrs John Dunn, Maple
 Hill. it is to be sent to James Brown Toronto
 John R. M. Donalds men and saw came to
 cut our wood. did not finish 897
