

September 1888

Sun Sept 16 cloudy some mists of rain a fine rain last night. George and Kate was out to day.

Mon Sept 17<sup>th</sup> flying clouds and moderate. I was digging potatoes. they are the best we have had for many years. Walter harrowed and drilled the little field with wheat North of the house.

Tue Sept 18<sup>th</sup> cloudy part of the day and pleasant. I was sowing timothy seed and cleaning out water furrows and finished cutting up corn. Walter was harrowing.

Wed Sept 19<sup>th</sup> clear most of the day and warm. was cleaning up wheat in the fore noon after noon took it to Thamesville sold it to game Mayhew for one dollar per bushel.

Thu Sept 20<sup>th</sup> clear and warm. I was digging potatoes in the fore noon. after noon husking corn. Walter away in the fore noon.

Fri Sept 21<sup>st</sup> clear and warm. I was spreading manure. Walter was plowing.

Sat Sept 22<sup>nd</sup> heavy fog most of the fore noon. after noon clear and hot. I was spreading manure part of the day part digging potatoes. Walter was plowing finished the fall wheat ground.

Sun Sept 23<sup>rd</sup> clear and hot.

Mon Sept 24<sup>th</sup> clear and hot in the middle of the day. Charley went to Thamesville ~~with~~ with a load of wheat this fore noon. after noon I was breaking clods and and Walter was harrowing the wheat ground. we commenced drilling after

Tue Sept 25<sup>th</sup> cloudy and pleasant. we finished <sup>tea</sup> sowing our wheat to day. which should have been sown ten days ago. the ground is very dry yet. it looks a little like rain to night.
