Alick Stevenson and Caribro Cameron are working with them. To 2 1/2 lbs steak 25^{cts} 5 lb neck 20^{cts}. Put at McErimmon's 1 bottle Electric oil 20. lozenges 5^{cts} Paid 50^{cts} for sugar & coal oil which I got on the 1st.
- 13 Jimmie went to Cornwall this afternoon
- 14 It snowed last night and is raw today Mrs Kennedy washing 25^{cts} To 1 lb tea 25^{cts} 2 bars soap 10^{cts}
- 15 Cold day. To 1 gall coal oil at Willie's 23 They finished thrashing about 11 A.M. thrashed 49^{cts} bush Pa gave Muddy 3^{cts} to part pay men
- 16 Muddy has a very bad cold and so has Marion Pa went out today
- 17 Rain & snow Muddy in bed all day Pa went to post office. Got his bill from D. H. Moad \$15^{cts} paid 10^{cts} due 5^{cts}. Jimmie came at 5 P.M.
- 18 Rain all day. not very cold, just ugly
- 19 Snow last night. Jimmie left for Cornwall 8 A.M. walked to the station rained and hailed now. 9 P.M. pouring rain. Stabled the cows the first time this winter
- 20 Sleets. The trees are covered with snow and ice, a limb broken on a maple by the well Snowy all day. Bit from Martinstown butcher 7 1/2 lbs steak 75^{cts} 5 lbs meat 42. Soap cone 8^{cts} Pa. went to Lake 5 o'clock dinner with Auntie Kaff

- 21 It was 8 P.M. when he got home last night he got wet. and is not well today. It was raining in turns all day, now 8 P.M. the wind is blowing 60 miles an hour
- 22 75 miles an hour in Montreal, and it is likely the same here. I went to see Mr Cunnison, who was hurt by his horse Sunday night, he is badly bruised and cut. The wind in Montreal yesterday was 73
- 23 Friday 9 P.M. I went in forenoon for Birdie The roads are very bad, got home about 7.30 P.M.
- 24 Froze pretty hard last night. Muddy was away all forenoon. Jimmie came about 10 A.M. A son of the late Kenneth, Hugh McErimmon, South Branch Currier today aged 34. Diff. paid 1.50 rent
- 25 Snowed this morning. Some runners on the roads. Rev M Matheson preached at 2.30 P.M. Muddy drove Birdie to the branch
- 26 Stormy snow and sleet. Muddy left at noon for North Lancaster. Sold Bellimore 2 bush oats. 25^{cts} P.M. 50
- 27 Plenty snow. Runners on the road. Put up the front porch
- 28 Alick P. Mc Dougall was buried at his home. Blue Donald. Took home two loads of straw yesterday To rooled out 25^{cts} Sold marriage license to a Lablan to marry a Miss To go all from front
- 29 Not so cold. Bible Society meeting in St A Hall. I put out white washing.
- 30 St Andrews day. fine sleighing Jimmie drove to Cornwall. I made a coloured washing. Whitford brought us 4 bags of potato bullets
